organized districts it is the duty of the recorder to call a special meeting of the miners and draw resolutions which should be signed by each miner and duly attested before a notary public, justice of the peace or attorney. As nearly as possible the townships should be described, and when not known some natural boundaries should be given. Unorganized districts the miners themselves should act independently or together as suggested above.

THE GREATER PORTION of the land to which the Mining Review refers is mountainous and unsurveyed, undoubtedly, and its character has not been determined fully by exploration. The government reserves all mineral bearing lands, excepting coal and iron, and where the mineral character has been determined, the railroad has the right to select from the Neu lands to make up the deficiency.

THE TRANSPORTATION of Western perishable fruits has been a monopoly of the refrigerator companies, but now the Southern Pacific, in conjunction with the Union Pacific and the Chicago & Northwestern railroads, have ordered between 1,200 and 1,500 ventilator cars, to be run in competition with the refrigerator system of the established companies. It cannot be claimed that the ventilator cars will preserve green fruit for as long a time as the refrigerator cars, but to offset this disadvantage a quicker time of transit will be adopted, and the shipper will thus be insured against loss by delays and consequent damage to the fruit.

THE GREAT POSSIBILITIES of the Central American states as producers and consumers make it a matter of wonder that patriotism does not assert itself above the ambitions of factional leaders, and end the internecine fights and brawls which surface to discourage investment of capital and the establishment of industries. A union of the states was entered into in 1823, but it only lasted until 1838. Several attempts have since been made to bring about federative union between Honduras, Nicaragua and Salvador, but Guatemala, evidently fearing the preponderance of the union against it, made objections when the plan approached consummation, and hostilities followed. Since then the states have been entirely separate, each a prey to leaders of willing followers who make an easy living by pretending to fight, and taking advantage of turmoil to rob-the leaders capturing the treasury and the followers looting the stores.
