

KILLED HIS FAMILY.

Chicago Contractor Slays Wife, Children and Himself.

SIX CORPSES IN THE HOUSE.

Asphyxiated by Gas—Three of the Children Fought for Life—Insane From Sunstroke.

Chicago, July 5.—Frederick Hellman, a well-to-do mason contractor, murdered his wife and four children last night and then killed himself. It was at first supposed that Hellman and his wife and children had met death by accident, but it developed at the coroner's inquest that a wholesale murderer had arranged to have them killed himself.

THE SINKING OF THE COLIMA.

United States Inspectors Find That No Body Was to Blame.

Washington City, July 5.—Gen. Dumont, supervising inspector general of steam vessels, has received from the inspector of the United States district the following report of the loss of the Pacific Mail steamship Colima:

"San Francisco, June 28, 1895.—Capt. Berningham, supervising inspector first district, has received from the inspector of the Pacific Mail Steamship Company's steamship Colima, J. F. Taylor, commander, J. M. Taylor, second mate, and crew of 82 persons all told, and 1,550 tons of cargo, foundered in a violent gale on the night of June 27, about forty miles south from Manzanillo, Colima, Mexico, on the Pacific coast, between Twenty-second and Twenty-sixth streets a week ago. New York, July 5.—The escape of Killoran, Russell and Allen from the Ludlow street jail yesterday morning promises to develop a lively scandal. They were detained by the officers of the Springfield post-office. The officers of the jail here pre-ferred to be greatly puzzled over how the prisoners managed to get their hands on the keys with which they overpowered their turnkeys. It developed today, however, that the three prisoners were allowed the greater freedom of the jail with them, and only recently it is learned they spent a whole evening in the recreation room playing bagatelle and dominoes with women visitors. There now seems to be little doubt as to how they secured the weapons with which they bulldozed their keepers.
