

CLAIM TO BE EXEMPT.

Sisters Object to Collection of Taxes on Their Academy.

COL. "TOM" EWING'S PROMISES

They Are Recalled in a Foreclosure Suit—Dr. Miller Answers About That \$1,000 Note.

An execution issued, claims Morrill has transferred to him and mortgages not exempt, in order to place them out of the jurisdiction of the court. HAD DEPOSITS TO PAY THE NOTE.

Dr. Miller Makes Vigorous Charges Answering Spencer's Suit.

Dr. P. B. M. Miller, who has been the chief clerk of the officers of the Merchants' National bank, filed an interesting answer in the superior court yesterday afternoon to the suit of J. Spencer on a \$1,000 note. Dr. Miller denies emphatically that he owes R. D. Spencer \$1,000 on a note, and then alleges that on May 29, 1895, and for a long time prior, the Merchants' National bank of Seattle was insolvent and contemplated insolvency. At the same time, according to the doctor's statement, every bank in the Seattle clearing house knew the condition of affairs in the Merchants' National bank, and that the bank was unable to pay its debts, and had been insolvent for a long time, but through its officers received from the Merchants' National bank notes, bills of exchange, bonds and other evidences of indebtedness to the Merchants' National bank, valued at \$250,000 and upwards. The note mentioned in Spencer's suit is said to be one of these evidences of indebtedness taken into the possession of the clearing house and not otherwise. After the notes and other evidences of indebtedness were delivered to the bank clearing house May 29, 1895, the bank closed its doors.
