

GEO. W. BOGGS IN JAIL

The Ex-Treasurer of Tacoma Not Able to Give Bail.

TREASURER OLDS TAKES OFFICE

Murder in a Saloon at Snohomish—Arguments in Progress in the Samish Murder Trial.

Tacoma, Oct. 31.—Special.—The bond of Geo. W. Boggs, ex-city treasurer, for the sum of \$20,000 to secure his attendance here in court to answer the charge of larceny by embezzlement and misappropriation of public funds, has not been filed in Justice McMurtry's court.

At the conclusion of the examination of the case was continued tomorrow. Mr. Boggs will pass the night at his hotel, in charge of a deputy sheriff.

Prosecuting Attorney B. W. Colner conducted the examination of the sureties, and his scrutiny of the bondsmen was searching and exhaustive in the extreme.

TACOMA'S NEW TREASURER.

Mr. Olds Furnishes a \$100,000 Bond and Takes Office.

Tacoma, Oct. 31.—Special.—Frederick T. Olds, who was elected treasurer of the city of Tacoma by the council yesterday, in place of James W. McCauley, removed today assumed his new duties, and took charge of his office.

The first official act of Treasurer Olds was the appointment of Herbert O. Fishback as his deputy. Mr. Fishback was formerly cashier of the Tacoma National bank, and has lately been in the employ of Philip Anderson, receiver of the bank.
