The groom is a young Englishman, who came to this country several years ago and has acquired a large business in real estate in St. Paul, where he will reside with his bride.

Every detail of the ceremony today was arranged on a scale of costly magnificence. Not only were the floral decorations of the church most handsome, but the music was very much out of the common, because of the appearance of Edward de Reszke, the famous basso, and Mme. Nordica, soprano from the Metropolitan opera company.
