LOOKING FOR HOMES.

Tide of Immigrants Gathering to Roll Westward.

MANY SIGNS OF PROSPERITY.

Samuel Hill's Hopeful Views—The Fast Train on the Union Pacific—Vessels Delayed by the Storm.

"A great stream of immigration, if indications do not fall, will be toward the Northwest during the coming year," said Samuel Hill, president of the Montana Central, yesterday.

"The present season has witnessed the visit of European immigration agents to this country, and there is no question that the eyes of prospective immigrants are upon us.

In Minnesota during October more land was patented to actual settlers than during any other month since that of 1883.

The work of the recent immigration congress in St. Paul will be of untold assistance in leading thrifty immigrants to desirable locations.

By the formation of state and local societies accurate information can be scattered broadcast, and the immigrant can find in the stretch of country reaching from St. Paul to Seattle, and with an average breadth of almost equal territory (except in California), contains only one town—Denver.

The northern belt is the one that will attract the immigrant and bring to us the citizen who will help to develop the country, and with his coming we will be able to produce what we need.

I am extremely hopeful of the future, and feel convinced that the Pacific Northwest will be a most prosperous territory if it is careful to preserve its credit by not going too deeply into debt."

Accompanying Mr. Hill was William H. Dunwoody, vice president of the Washington-Crocker Company, of Minneapolis, which produces 12,000 barrels of flour per day.

Mr. Dunwoody has been in the milling business as long as the state has existed, and during that time has maintained the distinction of having become the American who introduced American flour into Europe.

"I think Seattle will be able to maintain a mill with a production of 500 barrels per day," he said, "and that as soon as the Chinese become educated into eating bread instead of rice it could build up a trade with the Orient."

Mr. Hill and Mr. Dunwoody will leave for the East next Monday, and will stop in the Rockies for a few days' hunt.
