

SLOW AT DISARMING.

But the British in the Transvaal Will Have to Yield.

TOO MANY BOERS FOR THEM.

Talk of Cancelling the Rhodes Charter—Undoubtedly France and Russia Support Germany.

London, Jan. 9.—A dispatch to the Times from Johannesburg confirms the report that the British are slow at disarming.

It is estimated that there are 20,000 Boers in the Transvaal, and that the British are slow at disarming.

The directors of the Chartered South African Company have decided to request the government to institute an inquiry into Dr. Jameson's action.

The Times has an editorial which strongly protests against cancelling the Rhodes charter.

The secretary of state for the colonies, Joseph Chamberlain, has sent the following dispatch to President Kruger.

At a meeting of the London Radical Federation today a resolution was passed demanding the immediate removal of Emperor William from the British army and navy list.

At the foreign office this afternoon the dispatch saying that the Boers had demanded the cancellation of the Rhodes charter from Africa.

A special dispatch from Berlin this afternoon says that Russian co-operation with Germany in the Transvaal matter has been assured.

There is a feeling here that the Rhodes charter will be canceled, to prevent further discord.
