SILVER BILL PASSED.

The Senate's Vote 42 to 35 in Favor of Free Coinage.

TWO YEARS FROM WASHINGTON.

The Populist Amendments All Voted Down by Decisive Majorities.

Silver Leaders All Realize That the Passage of the Bill Will Have No Effect but to Put the Senate on Record—Mills Votes Against the Bill and So Does McBride of Oregon.

Washington City, Feb. 1.—The long contest over the silver bill is at an end in the senate. The bill for the free silver coinage substitute of the house bill by the decisive vote of 42 to 35—a majority of 7 for free silver. This result was reached after a day of bitter and sharp parliamentary fencing. The public interest in the culmination of the protracted struggle was shown by the crowded galleries and the full attendance on the floor, seventy-seven senators being present and the others paired. Baron Thielmann, the German ambassador, occupied a front seat in the diplomatic gallery, showing keen interest in the final vote. Members of the house crowded the chamber, filling the available seats and standing room in the rear. The bill was read at 10 o'clock, and the vote was taken at 2 o'clock, but these were summarily cut off by a strict construction of the agreement, although the difference over the executive order held off the vote for an hour beyond the time set. The result was such a foregone conclusion that little excitement or surprise was shown by the passage of the bill.

Washington City, Feb. 1.—The session of the senate was opened at 11 o'clock with a speech by the venerable senator from Vermont, Morrill, who said the house had promptly responded to the president's message and supplemented it with an emergency tariff revenue bill. The free silver substitute for the bill, he added, "may not be silver to me when broad has been asked for and a stone has been presented, but it is the first time a committee of the senate seems to have permitted a practical joke almost good enough for a clown at Barnum's menagerie." The senator thought a deficient national income should not have been less swiftly remedied than an excess, saying: "The present administration, by exhibiting lavish diffidence about acknowledging any deficiency of the revenue derived from the tariff. Bereaved of parents in early infancy, but with their hands behind them, they may quietly take whatever money congress may place in their hands for the treasury, where the outflow of gold has been arrested, and the heads of the keepers dizzy." If our late investments of nearly \$200,000,000 in silver have been so profitable, why do you not open all our mints to the free coinage of the silver of the world?"

DECLINE OF SALISBURY

England Does Not Indorse His Treatment of America.

NOR OF THE ARMENIANS, EITHER

English Diplomacy Regarding Turkey Has Blundered Grievously.

The Lame Excuses of the Premier's Speech Disappoint Even His Partisans—The Liberals to Overhaul the Government's Policy Toward Venezuela and Armenia.

Copyrighted by the Associated Press. London, Feb. 1.—In spite of the social and political gloom, there has been a revival of political activity, due to the approach of the reassembling of parliament. Several speeches on politics were delivered during the week, the most noteworthy being that of Salisbury at the meeting of Non-Conformist Unionists at the Hotel Metropole on Friday. On the whole, the marquis is said to have disappointed his warm admirers, especially in his exposure of the weakness of Great Britain in the East, and of his explanations of her reasons for non-interference in Armenia. His repeated acceptance of the Monroe doctrine, however, shows that the common sense policy advocated by Mr. Gladstone in the treatment of the Venezuelan question is finding root in high quarters, and this is a most timely showing, for public sentiment is becoming strongly opposed to the premier's attitude toward America, North as well as South. Right Hon. George Goschen, first lord of the admiralty, will, it is announced, move the address in the house of commons in reply to the queen's speech at the opening of parliament, and Sir John Maxwell will second the motion. The stand taken by the government in regard to the Armenian and Irish questions will be challenged by the Liberals. Mr. Justin McCarthy has summoned a meeting of the Irish parliament on Saturday, for the purpose of discussing the reform organization movement will be considered. Mr. McCarthy, it is said, will be re-elected chairman of the meeting.

The St. James Gazette this afternoon announced that it had learned that the government had settled, so far as possible, the program for the work of the session. QUEEN VICTORIA'S GRIEF.

Has Not Broken Her Health—The Funeral of Prince Henry.

London, Feb. 1.—In spite of the fact that they have been suffering a terrible grief, the queen and Princess Beatrice have continued to enjoy excellent health. The queen has granted to the widowed princess the use of the late prince's residence at Osborne house, near Osborne, a private place, formerly occupied by the late Sir Henry Ponsonby, for many years the secretary to the queen and keeper of the private purse, who died last year. Princess Beatrice has resolved to make her home on the sale of the house, which her husband was governor and where he was murdered, and her majesty will start for the continent two weeks after, but previously determined upon staying for Cimex during the first week of March.

All the arrangements for the funeral of Prince Henry of Battenberg have been completed. The remains will be entombed in Whiphincham church at 12:30 p. m., on Wednesday next, and the ceremonies will be most impressive. The body was transferred at Funchal, island of Madeira, from the Blonde to the first-class cruiser Blenheim. The last named warship almost immediately afterward started for England. The Blenheim conveyed the remains of the late Sir John Thompson, the Canadian premier, who died suddenly at Windsor castle, on the morning of the arrival of the Blenheim at Portsmouth, the body of Prince Henry of Battenberg will be transferred to the royal yacht Alberta, and will be taken across the Solent to the Isle of Wight. The royal yacht will remain on board the ship. The body rests on a light, erected on the quarter deck, draped with light blue and white and with the British ensign. The Davis Will Case Again. Chicago, Feb. 1.—The Davis will trial, which was in the courts of Montana for several years, is likely to be fully ventilated in Chicago. This morning a bill was filed in the United States circuit court by Erwin Davis, of New York, brother of A. J. Davis, the multi-millionaire, whose vast fortune was at issue. A. J. Davis died at Butte, Mont., March 11, 1891, leaving an estate worth about \$1,000,000. In the midst of the turmoil among the dead man's relatives a will was found, leaving to Thomas, son of A. J. Davis, and Mrs. Besgot a share of the property, and the balance to his brother, John A. The children and heirs of the other relatives of the dead millionaire contested the will, declaring it a forgery, but later entered into an agreement for a division of the property. This was decreed by the court. Erwin, brother of A. J. Davis, attacks the compromise and asks the court to restrain the children of John A. Davis from receiving any of the estate, and exhibits a decree, signed by all the living brothers and sisters of the deceased, including John A. Davis, in whose favor the court is inclined to give half of the money received to Erwin, considering the fact of his furnishing the money to fight the claims of Beggot's children. A similar issue is being contested in the Montana courts.
