The Bond Bidders Drawing Gold From the Treasury.

ONLY FORTY-TWO MILLIONS LEFT

Low-Water Mark Reached at Last—Depositories in Various Cities Where Bonds May Be Paid For.

Washington City, Feb. 10.—Gold to the amount of \$2,381,000 was today withdrawn from the sub-treasury at New York, presumably to be used again in making payments for bonds. This leaves the true amount of the gold reserve \$4,066,883. Up to the hour of closing the department had no official notice of deposits on account of bond purchases.
