MORE THAN 100 SLAIN

The Horrible Dynamite Explosion at Johannesburg.

MANY BODIES TORN TO PIECES.

A Relief Fund of \$500,000 Raised—In the Day of Affliction Boers and Ultrarightists Fraternize.

Johannesburg, Feb. 20.—Details are reaching this city today of what was probably the most disastrous dynamite explosion on record in any part of the world.

Victims were mostly Malays, Kafirs and Chinese, who subsist for the most part by doing odd jobs about the place, which is a railway transfer station for the mining districts.

The explosion was caused by a dynamite charge which exploded in a tunnel.
