

FLEEING FROM ITALY

Men Who Don't Want to Be Forced Into the Army. AND SENT TO FIGHT MELEK.

Gen. Barattieri Assumes All Responsibility for the Battle of Adowa and Is Ready to Face Charges.

Paris, March 12.—The railroad trains crossing the frontier from Italy are crowded with Italians who are leaving the country to escape military service in Africa.

New York, March 12.—A special to the Herald from Rome says: It is learned that the Marquis di Rudini has promised not to take any proceedings against Signor Crispi.

The statement that Emperor William of Germany has opened negotiations with Austria to revive the Austro-German treaty of alliance in the sense that an attack by France on Germany shall be the "casus oedieris" for Austria is unfounded.

Gen. Barattieri will arrive at Naples on March 24, and will come to Rome immediately. It is now improbable that he will be tried by court-martial.

STATEMENT BY BARATTIERI

He Was in Such a Strait That an Attack Was Necessary.

Rome, March 12.—Gen. Barattieri has arrived at Massowah, in a physically and mentally prostrated condition. He admitted to a correspondent of the Tribuna that he had yielded to a rash impulse in making the attack, which led to the defeat at Adowa.

Gen. Barattieri has been confident that even a partial victory would put an end to an untenable position, and would cause the Shoa to withdraw. The difficulties of the ground, the ill health of the troops, the lack of supplies, and the deep deplored the disaster, but had nothing to reproach himself with, and was ready to meet charges and to endure to the end the consequences of his misfortune.

Appeal of the Armenians to America.

London, March 12.—A letter is published here, addressed to the Oregon bishops of the United States. The letter is the intended massacre, the bishops wrote the sultan this farewell letter, protesting that the sultan had been misled in opposing the Armenians.

They have been strenuously opposed to your mission work among us, and those bloody days have proved that some of our Protestant brethren have become staunch defenders of our honor and faith. You at least know that our times in the eyes of the world have been darkened.

Irishmen Oppose the Naval Estimates. London, March 12.—The vote on the navy estimates in the house of commons were obstructed by the Irish members, who called for numerous divisions.

The Anglo-German Loan to China.

London, March 12.—The financial article in the Daily News believes it is probable that the Anglo-German loan to China will be signed at Peking yesterday by the Anglo-German syndicate.

Russia Now Controls Turkey.

St. Petersburg, March 12.—A Constantinople correspondent writes that, thanks to the diplomatic successes of M. de Nihiloff, Russia's relations with Constantinople, Turkey's relations, so far as the Balkans and Egypt are concerned, will in future be entirely controlled by Russia.

Turkey to Expel the Missionaries.

London, March 12.—A Moscow correspondent of the Daily News believes it is probable that the British and American missionaries in Asia Minor, such a measure would be quite consonant with the wishes of the Russian government.

England Worried About the Derivatives.

London, March 12.—Lord Marshall Lord Wodeley, commander-in-chief of the navy, was summoned to a cabinet council yesterday. He consulted Lord Lansdowne, secretary of state for war, probably in connection with an advance of Egyptian troops upon Donga.

Women Nearly Win at Cambridge.

London, March 12.—The senate of Cambridge University by a vote of 18 to 17, has rejected the proposition to appoint a committee to consider the question of conferring degrees upon women.

The Exploitation of Ashantes.

London, March 12.—The Times says the colonial office has been asked to sanction a chartered company to exploit Ashantes, but that it is unlikely that it will consent.

Honduras Under Martial Law.

BIG FIRE IN BOSTON.

The Pope Manufacturing Co.'s Building Destroyed WITH MORE THAN 1,800 BICYCLES

The "Youth's Companion" Building Drenched With Water—The Loss Nearly \$400,000.

Boston, March 12.—The Pope Manufacturing Company's building on Columbus avenue was completely gutted by fire, necessitating a general alarm, shortly before 6 o'clock today.

The "Youth's Companion" building, consisting of 170 new bicycles, 17 second-hand bicycles, and 20,000 pieces of bicycle fittings, beside several thousand tires.

The most imposing structures in the city, which is separated from the burned building by a 15-foot alley, and the Hoffman house, a seven-story house across the street, were thoroughly drenched.

The Hoffman house was for an hour in great danger, as the strong northwest wind carried the flames nearly halfway across the broad avenue.

At a late hour tonight it was definitely stated that the insurance on the building owned by Col. Pope, placed in twenty-six companies, was again settled.
