

REASON FOR IT. There is a Loud Cry for Economy.

COUNTY CLERK'S IDEAS. Mr. Gordon Talks Plainly and Reminds Mr. Heaton of Mrs. Summerville.

There is a woman in it. That seems to be the consensus of opinion in the courtroom in regard to the fight now being waged by County Commissioner W. H. Heaton against County Clerk Thomas W. Gordon and the woman whose name is given as Summerville's widow, so they say. She is said to know Mr. Heaton quite well, and to wield over him an influence that has made it impossible for him to do anything but as she wishes to have caused him no end of an annoyance. Mr. Gordon regards the fight against economy as an attempt at interference in the household of another, and he points out that if he would consent to giving the Summerville woman a position in his office there would be an end to the howl of economy. In addition to what has just been said, it is related that Mr. Heaton and Mr. Gordon were very good friends until the former's commission expired last year. Mr. Heaton was asked for the loan of \$500 on his personal note. As Mr. Gordon was unable or unwilling to accommodate the commissioner, a cold war sprang up, and the officials have not yet been able to work in harmony, and this effort suggests that if Shakespeare were writing about the inside in the courtroom he might add to the saying "for loan of loss look to the friend."

Receiver for Fairhaven Road. On application of the Atlantic Trust Company, trustee of the first mortgage bonds, Judge Hanford yesterday appointed as receiver of the Fairhaven and New Whatcom Railway Company, fixing his bond at \$500. The road is showing to be insolvent, a sale of its property is ordered, and March 20 is set as the day when the receiver should take possession.

Drove the Cows Away. The last act of the drama of the times yesterday was an action by John O'Leary vs. James Harris, relative to certain property taken by O'Leary under an alleged bill of sale. There were several horses and cows, the latter of which, it is said, belonged to Mrs. Harris, and these were driven away by O'Leary. A defense was put in that the conveyance was made to O'Leary temporarily, in order to afford Harris an opportunity to recover himself from a financial snarl, but that O'Leary betrayed his friend and enforced the bill of sale, to which Mrs. Harris had not been a party. The case was left in the hands of the jury.

The Test Case. The test case of the people of the state of Washington, on the relation of W. H. Heaton, was yesterday decided by Judge Hanford in favor of the plaintiff, a writ of mandamus. The case, which involves the question of mileage for county commissioners, is now ready for appeal to the supreme court. It has been pointed out that the title is defective, in that it contains the words "the people," the constitution providing that all process shall run in the name of the state.

Is the Gift a Valid One? By an action begun in the superior court yesterday, the Portland Cracker Company attacks the validity of a deed of gift to an interest in the estate of Martin V. Stewart, deceased, the object being to enforce payment of a note for \$100. The note was executed by W. Stewart and endorsed by W. Burritt, and dated June 2, 1892. The deed of gift was made in consideration of love and affection, and purported to convey all interest in the estate to Mary Ella Stewart.

For a Carload of Shingles. The Washington National bank yesterday filed a suit against the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railroad for \$16,190, alleged damages for the wrongful delivery of a car load of shingles. The shipment was consigned from Hartford to Chicago & Co., at Moonmouth, Ill., but is said to have been delivered to the Green-Lombard Lumber Company, at Chicago.

A Defective Information. In the criminal court yesterday Gus Aristotle escaped trial on a charge of petty larceny because the information against him was defective. He was charged with having stolen two coats from the John Scham Company, each valued at \$4 cents. The prisoner will be held until a new information is prepared.

Maple Valley Graduates. The exercises for graduation of the '96 class in the Maple Valley public schools were held Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of the present week, conducted by County Superintendent Laybush and Prof. G. R. Peterson, principal. The exercises were held in the evening, and the papers will be graded today, and the graduating exercises will be held next Friday.

At Two Per Cent. a Month. Default in interest at the rate of 2 per cent a month has involved M. P. Knox in a suit in the superior court. The complainant is the First National bank, and the defendant is M. P. Knox. As security for the note a mortgage has been given on the plant of the People's Call.

The Dawson Case Today. The Dawson divorce case will come up in Judge Humes' department of the superior court at 9:30 this morning on the application of Mrs. E. Dawson. She asks for a divorce, and also for \$100 with which to prepare her case.

HERBERT BOOTH HERE En Route to Report to Headquarters for Duty.

IS RECALLED FROM CANADA. Unlike His Brother Ballington He Obeys the Order and Will Fight Under the "Old Flag."

Commandant Herbert Booth, who for six years has been in charge of the Salvation Army work in Canada, was recalled from his post in that country to report to headquarters for assignment to another field of duty. He is a son of Commander William Booth and was recalled from Canada at the same time that his older brother, Ballington Booth, was recalled from the command of the army in the United States. Ballington Booth, instead of obeying the order recalling him, has organized a new army. His younger brother was more obedient, and without knowing for what new field he is now being sent has just taken leave of the work and the people whom he has served faithfully, and among whom he is held in high esteem.

COULD NOT GET INTO JAIL. A Redmond Man Bearing His Own Commitment Refused Admission.

The unique occurrence of a man bearing his own commitment being refused admission to the county jail took place at the courthouse yesterday. During the day Julius Furkman was visited by an athletic young fellow of the name of Carl Carlson, of Redmond, who delivered a document signed by D. H. Birkelle, justice of the peace, and stating that Carlson had been arrested on a charge of battery and committed on March 16, on one Phineas Thayer, Carlson, therefore, had been fined \$10, and taxed with the costs, amounting to \$20. Carlson refused to pay, and was sentenced to ten days in the county jail.

Another Dr. Lyons. Dr. J. H. Lyons, of this city, was awakened at an early hour yesterday morning by a series of violent knocks at his door. No sooner had he turned on the light than he found three or four of his friends, who immediately surrounded him, and commenced a regular "joy dance." The bewildered doctor walked until the excitement had subsided, and then inquired the occasion of the demonstration. One of his friends showed him a copy of the Post-Intelligencer, in which appeared the news of a Roslyn date line, that Dr. J. H. Lyons had been murdered. Dr. Lyons explained that there were two Dr. Lyons, one of whom had lived at Roslyn for eight or nine years. "I am certain," added the doctor, "that I am not dead." All day long the telephone kept ringing, and a majority of times this question was asked: "Was it the doctor that was killed at Roslyn?"

LIVELY BURGLARS. Their Depredations Cause the Police to Make a Roundup.

The sudden spurt taken by burglars caused a decided stir among the policemen and detectives yesterday. If there was a suspicious character in town he was picked out by the police for inspection. The most important one caught in the dragnet was "Peg-leg" Sheldon, but he convinced the police that he was working for a living now and consequently was allowed to go free. Among the other arrested are Frank Howard, aged 27, a waiter; Edgar Marshall, 16, bootblack; James Whitnall, 21, "rodman"; W. E. Harris, 22, sailor; Charles Williams, 16, messenger; Alfred Harris, 31, miner; John Burdett, 19, laborer; H. Davis, 41, clerk; Frank McCall, 37, laborer, and Clarence Laughrey, 14, schoolboy. Several of the prisoners are well known to the police, especially W. Harris, who was arrested in this city several years ago for grand larceny.
