WASHINGTON CITY, March 25.—The first reference to the adjournment of congress came in the senate today, in a formal resolution offered by Platt, proposing an adjournment on May 2. The resolution was referred to the appropriations committee, as any determination as to adjournment must depend upon the condition of the appropriation bills.
