BRYAN FINALLY EVICTED

He Rushes to the Barber Shop on Hearing the News.

THEN RECEIVES MANY CALLERS

He Declares First of All Against a Second Presidential Term.

A Great Throng Gathers in the Street at Night, and Bryan Speaks to Them

He Has No Campaign Plans, and Did Not Expect the Nomination.

Chicago, July 10.—Mr. Bryan received the announcement of his nomination with all the composure and calmness of a man who had been used to such things during a long career.

"The issue of this campaign is the money question (long continued applause) and we cannot be driven from our faith in the free and unlimited coinage of silver at the rate of 16 to 1, independent of the gold standard.

"To the American people: In order that I may have no ambition but to discharge faithfully the duties of the office, I announce that if elected president I shall under no circumstances be a candidate for re-election.

Before he could complete this work a number of persons desiring to extend congratulations had arrived, but he excused himself to them until he could receive the message.

Mr. Bryan bowed and stepped back and was taken through the narrow street and was taken up and continued for a block in either direction.

The band played a parting salute to the new nominee before resuming its march to the depot, and Mr. Bryan returned to the window, where he waved a parting adieu to the hurrying crowd below.
