




There is no rest for the schiever, and he realizes that Everett is a city of magnificent distances, even though covered by the forest and covered by the mill.

In short, tonnage between the Pacific and Atlantic coasts requires the shipment of 200 miles further to and from Seattle and other cities than from Everett.

The Great Northern railroad crosses the Cascade from Puget sound to Chicago. It follows the south fork of the Snohomish, reaches the Sound at its mouth, reaches the Duwamish, and crosses the city by means of a tunnel.



Briefly summarized, the shingle mill in operation last year had a daily capacity of 70,000, employing in the aggregate 144 men, who received \$2,500 per month.

An important industry was put in operation here in the summer of 1935 by the California Fruit Package Company, organized with a capital of \$2,000,000.
