

THE MCKINLEY VOTE.

It Will Exceed That of Any Previous Election.

PROBABLY SIXTY PER CENT.

He Will Break the Record in Popular Majority.

IT IS ONLY A QUESTION OF SIZE.

No solid South—Delaware, Kentucky, Maryland, West Virginia, etc.

This has been a record-breaking campaign in many ways, but in none will it prove to be more so than in its final result.

The only presidents who ever received a majority of the popular vote are Andrew Jackson, Martin Van Buren, William Henry Harrison, Franklin Pierce, Lincoln (in 1860) and Grant.

A glance at the popular vote of some recent presidential elections may be of interest in this connection, and I have dug out the official figures for each as follows:

MARK YOUR TICKET BY PLACING AN "X" IN THE SPACE AT THE RIGHT OF THE NAME OF THE POLITICAL DESIGNATION OF THE PARTY FOR WHOM CANDIDATES YOU WISH TO VOTE.

IF YOU DESIRE TO VOTE FOR ANY CANDIDATE OF ANY OTHER PARTY PLACE AN "X" IN THE SPACE AT THE RIGHT OF THE NAME OF SUCH CANDIDATE.

DO NOT PUT ANY MARKS ON THE LEFT OF THE NAMES. THE NAMES OF CANDIDATES FOR THE LEGISLATURE AND FOR COUNTY OFFICERS FOLLOW THE STATE OFFICERS ON THE FULL BALLOT.

Table for Presidential Electors with columns: Vote for Four, Republican, Democrat, People's Party, Prohibition, National.

Table for Congressmen with columns: Vote for Two, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition, National.

Table for Supreme Court with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for Governor with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for Lieutenant-Governor with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition, National.

Table for Secretary of State with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for State Treasurer with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for State Auditor with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for Attorney-General with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for Superintendent of Public Instruction with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for Commissioner of Public Lands with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

Table for State Printer with columns: Vote for One, Republican, People's Party, Prohibition.

IF YOU INTEND TO VOTE THE STRAIGHT TICKET, PUT "X" OPPOSITE THE PARTY NAME. IF YOU INTEND TO SPLIT YOUR VOTE, THE SAFEST PLAN IS TO PUT "X" OPPOSITE EVERY NAME YOU WISH TO VOTE FOR.

WHAT TO DO. Put X only in the space to the right. If you want to vote the straight ticket put X opposite the name of the party.

THE ELECTION LAW.

SIMPLE DIRECTIONS ENBODIED IN THE STATE LAW.

A Little Care Will Make Every Ballot Count—Do Not Be in a Hurry to Make a Mark and Leave the Booth—Remember That This Year There is a Principle Involved, and Make That the Chief Consideration.

The following extracts from the state election law should be carefully read by every voter. They are exceedingly simple, and if ordinary intelligence is exercised and haste avoided, no voter need fear making a mistake.

At any election it shall be the duty of the inspector, or one of the judges of election, to deliver ballots to the qualified electors. Any elector desiring to vote shall give his name to the inspector or one of the judges, who shall then, in an audible tone of voice, announce the same, whereupon a challenge may be interposed in the manner provided by law.

On receipt of his ballot the elector shall forthwith and without leaving the polling place retire alone to one of the places, booths or apartments provided to prepare his ballot. If he desires to vote for all the candidates of any political party he may mark a cross "X" after the name, against the political designation of such party, and shall then be deemed to have voted for all the persons named as the candidates of such party.

In another column is given part of the state ballot. All of the ballot for state officers should be found the candidates of the state legislature and county and a ballot on the proposed constitutional amendment and to determine whether or not the same is in favor of a proposed township organization.

MARKING THE BALLOT.

A Few Hints to Voters in Reply to Questions as to a Split Ticket.

QUESTION—I WANT TO VOTE THE STRAIGHT REPUBLICAN AND COUNTY TICKET, BUT FOR THE FREE SILVER (BRYAN) ORS. HOW SHALL I MARK MY BALLOT? ANSWER—MARK YOUR BALLOT THUS:

QUESTION—I INTEND TO VOTE THE REPUBLICAN TICKET FOR PERSONAL REASONS, I WANT TO VOTE FOR LEWIS FOR CONGRESSMAN. CAN I DO IT, AND HOW? ANSWER—MARK YOUR TICKET AS BELOW, BUT BE SURE AND TWO CROSSES IN THE CONGRESSIONAL LIST, ONE FOR EITHER LEWIS OR DOOLITTLE, IF YOU DON'T DO THIS, YOU WILL ONLY VOTE FOR CONGRESSMAN.

QUESTION—I WANT TO VOTE FOR BRYAN AND THE PEOPLE'S PARTY TICKET, EXCEPT THAT I DON'T WANT TO VOTE FOR ROBERTS. SHALL I DO IT? ANSWER—PUT X AGAINST PEOPLE'S PARTY AT HEAD OF COLUMN AND X OPPOSITE NAME OF P. C. SULLIVAN, THUS:

QUESTION—I AM GOING TO VOTE THE ENTIRE REPUBLICAN TICKET, BUT I WANT TO CAST A VOTE FOR ONE JUDGE OF ANOTHER COUNTY. SHALL I DO IT? ANSWER—YES; PUT X OPPOSITE THE REPUBLICAN TICKET, AGAINST THE NAME OF THE JUDGE, BUT BE SURE AND PUT TWO CROSSES IN THE CONGRESSIONAL LIST, AS THERE ARE MEMBERS ELECTED FOR THAT OFFICE IN YOUR DISTRICT.

QUESTION—WILL MY BALLOT BE THROWN OUT IF I PUT AN X AGAINST THE NAME OF THE LEGISLATURE IN MY DISTRICT. HOW DO I DO IT?
