

NEWS FROM TACOMA.

WAR IN PROGRESS BETWEEN SEATTLE AND TACOMA BREWERS. Fifty Per Cent. Cut Announced in the Price of Beer, and It Means "Two Schooners for a Nickel" - History of the Controversy That Has Led to the Present Trouble - President Loeb, of the Milwaukee, Talks About the Fight, and Says He Will Not Meet the Cut.

TACOMA, March 20.—There is the liveliest kind of a fight on between the big brewers of Seattle and Tacoma. It is a war to the knife and it is earnest. The belligerents are the Milwaukee Brewing Company, the Puget Sound Brewery, of Tacoma, and the Seattle Brewing and Maltting Company, of Seattle. The Capital Brewery of Olympia has not been drawn into the imbroglio as yet, but it will doubtless be affected by the war, as, of course, participate in the festivities.

During the last three or four days the saloon men of this city have been notified that the Seattle Brewing Company would announce a cut of \$4 per barrel on its beer and by the middle of the week would be in a petition to supply beer in any quantity. At present the beer is sold by a fine plant fitted with costly machinery of the latest pattern at the head of Commencement bay. After being in operation a little over a year the company, when the plant was finally brought into use, the Puget Sound Brewery, and has since remained idle.

The three Seattle brewers at the time were the Albrecht Brewing Company, Clausen & Swensen's brewery and the Hay View Brewery. These afterward consolidated under the name of the Seattle Brewing and Maltting Company. When these matters had been consummated, a combination was entered into between the Seattle people and the Puget Sound Brewery by which both concerns agreed not to invade the territory of the other. A uniform price was agreed upon, and no cut was to be made. Since the date of the agreement there has been no Seattle beer sold in Tacoma, and the Puget Sound Brewery has kept out of Seattle.

Four years ago the United States Brewery was purchased by Sam Loeb and Albert Weinberg, of this city, and run under the name of the Milwaukee Brewery. The Seattle brewers had a small interest in the brewery, enough to enable them to have a voice in the management, but Loeb and Weinberg purchased enough stock to enable them to control it. The capacity was enlarged, and nearly three years ago the price of the beer was reduced to \$7 per barrel. The Milwaukee people established an agency in Seattle and pushed their product vigorously. At present a number of Seattle saloons are selling beer made in Tacoma by the Milwaukee Brewery.

The Seattle brewers stood this sort of thing uncomplainingly for some time, but about a year ago, according to the statement of the proprietors of the Seattle Brewery, opened negotiations by which it was hoped the Tacoma brewers would be persuaded to leave Seattle. These efforts came to nothing.

Several weeks ago it was announced that the Seattle brewers had decided to open war on their Tacoma competitors. The matter has been the subject of street talk for several days, but today the Seattle announcement was made that the Seattle brewing company had announced a cut of \$4 per barrel on beer, and would be in a position to fill orders from Tacoma saloons by Thursday of the coming week. President Sam Loeb, of the Milwaukee Brewery, said today regarding the fight: "We are prepared for anything that may come. For several days I have known that the Seattle brewing company had decided to make a 50 per cent. cut on beer and would do all in their power to occupy the field here. I have told them that I will sell them beer at the same price as I introduce them to the trade here. Will they come? I will be awfully disappointed if they don't."

"Now as to the merits of this controversy, I want to say that our people have never cut the price of beer. We made the price of Milwaukee beer \$7 per barrel. This was \$1 lower than that charged by the Seattle brewery. The price has been kept at this figure. I know that we are engaged in selling beer in Seattle at a less figure than this, but it is not true. More than this, we will not cut the price, no matter what figure the Seattle beer is sold at here. It is an effort to force us out of the Seattle field, or else to raise our prices up to a level with that charged by the Seattle brewery. This is something we will never do. I am quite satisfied with the condition of our trade in Seattle, which we have built up during the hard times of the past three years. We will not give this up without a struggle."

What attitude the Puget Sound brewery will take in the fight remains to be seen. This brewery has a large trade in Tacoma and surrounding towns, but has made no effort whatever to gain a foothold in Seattle. The Capital Brewery, of Olympia, having lately entered the Tacoma field, will doubtless meet the cut made by the Seattle brewery.

TO INOCULATE SQUIRRELS.

Eastern Washington Farmers Will Try a New Plan to Get Rid of the Little Pests.

RITZVILLE, March 19.—The farmers of this vicinity are preparing to try a new plan for getting rid of the much dreaded squirrels.

For years these little pests have been the greatest drawback to wheat raising in Eastern Washington. They come out as soon as the cold weather is over. They are a small, grayish animal about the size of a rat, and abound in such numbers that it is a thing almost impossible to see several acres of grain scattered over the field mowed as clean as one could cut it with a scythe, where these little animals have cut their way.

As soon as they come out in the spring the farmers begin to buy strychnine and poison them. This is not very expensive, costing every farmer from \$50 to \$100 for poison, besides a man's time for a couple of months, but it does not accomplish the purpose, and they are becoming more numerous every year. Various remedies have been tried by the different counties as well as private individuals, costing thousands of dollars, but all to no avail.

It is now proposed to inoculate a contagious disease among them, it being claimed by the Chicago Vaccine Company, of Chicago, who have been experimenting along this line, that this can be successfully done, as they have discovered a certain disease which, when inhaled, is most eaten by the squirrels, will kill the victim within a few hours and is contagious to all others coming in contact with it. If this can be done successfully it will relieve farmers of a pest as much dreaded as the famous English sparrow, and will be worth an inestimable sum to the wheat growers of Eastern Washington.

TRAPS ARE PROHIBITED.

Government Order Spreads Contention Among District Fish Columbia Salmon Canneries.

VANCOUVER, B. C., March 20.—Contention prevails among local canners on account of the announcement that the Dominion government will prohibit the use of traps for catching salmon at Boundary bay. Several canneries have invested large sums of money in traps, and they consider that the action of the government in prohibiting them due warning is most unfair. It is also rumored that an import duty will shortly be placed on salmon brought from the American side, where several canneries have traps. The fish at present are brought in free.

As the result of the news work has been stopped on the erection of several new canneries, while some canners are seriously considering the advisability of building on the American side of the boundary line.

Kittitas County Funds.

WENATCHEE, March 19.—A few years ago J. F. Travers, as county treasurer of Kittitas county, deposited the county funds with a bank, which afterwards failed. The money was deposited with the knowledge and consent of the county commissioners, and this fact served as one ground for contention between the present officials and the ex-treasurer. The supreme court has held that there is no difference, however, as the treasurer was, and not the county commissioners, responsible for the money.

The court further concluded that three of the appellants who signed the bond were married women at the time, and the lower court erred in entering personal judgment against them, for which their separate estates were liable. It is contended that their joining in the contract did no more than to subject the community property to the judgment obtained upon the bond. The supreme court has ruled that while a married woman has not an unlimited right to contract with reference to community property, she has that right with reference to her separate estate, and that the effect of this contract is to subject the entire property, both community and separate, to the satisfaction of a judgment of this kind.

Dredging at Everett.

EVERETT, March 20.—Dredging in the harbor is progressing steadily night and day under the direction of Supt. Ferry, of the New York Dredging Company. The dredging done under the present contract will be 200 feet long by 50 feet wide, with an average depth of five feet of earth removed. The dredging began about 2:30 feet south of the dike, and the dirt is delivered through a long pipe a thousand feet inside the channel. The dredger pumps about 1,000 yards of earth in twenty-four hours. It operates night and day with a crew of twenty-five men.

When the dredger gets opposite the dike the dirt will be thrown outside it. About \$300 worth of work will be done here under the present contract, and at the rate of progress thus far it will be finished next week, after which the dredger will go to La Conner.
