ODD FELLOWSHIP ANNIVERSARY.

Twenty-eight Years Ago Today the Order Was Started in America. Today is the twenty-eighth anniversary of Odd Fellowship in the United States, and as such will be fittingly celebrated in every hamlet, town or city in which a lodge is located.

The order, which exists chiefly in Great Britain and this country, first sprang up from societies of mechanics and laborers who existed in London in the latter part of the eighteenth century, calling themselves Ancient and Honorable Loyal Odd Fellows. From this society sprang the "Union Order of Odd Fellows," which had its seat of government in London and spread rapidly to other English cities.

The order in America has had its headquarters in the United States since 1831, when several seceding lodges from the Manchester Unity, in 1831, an extra-territorial committee was established in Manchester to govern the order in the interim between the sessions of the Grand Lodge or national movable committee, as it is termed, and the Manchester Unity still constitutes the main body of British Odd Fellows. It numbers about 500,000 members.

In this country Thomas Wildy and four others organized the first lodge, No. 1, in Baltimore, April 28, 1831, to work according to the usage of the London or Manchester order. A lodge was organized in Seattle March 26, 1897, and one in Philadelphia December 28, 1831, both of which received grand charters from Baltimore in June, 1832. At the same time a grand charter was granted to the past grand lodge of New York since the order has been established in every state and territory of the Union.

In 1881 the Degree of Rebekah was adopted by the Grand Lodge of the United States for the use of ladies legally connected with subordinate lodges by male membership.
