The committee has aimed to give the wool-grower a rate of duty which will average from 20 to 25 per cent. This is higher than the rates of earlier tariffs. In doing this it is giving a higher protection upon the raw material than upon the manufactured product in every case.

How is it possible to defend the increase of duty on lead, asked Vest, unless you leave it in order to feed the voracious taste of these monopolists? On earthenware and crockery the senator said the duties were appalling. The duties of the bill had undertaken to make the duties absolutely prohibitory.

NEWS FROM TACOMA.

CASE, THE ROBBER, IDENTIFIED BY AN OREGONIAN. Judge Riddle, a Pioneer, Recognizes the Dead Desperado-The Highwayman Thought to Have Had a Pal, Who Caught the Wrong Car-Dame's Arm Permanently Injured-Conductors Visit the Court-McRae Case to Come Up in City-Today.

Tacoma Bureau of the Post-Intelligencer, Tacoma, May 25.—The identification of Jack Case, the train robber, highwayman, larcenist and divers other kinds of crook, was made complete today by Judge Riddle, an Oregon pioneer, who, with his father, and other members of the family, settled the little town of Riddle, Douglas county, Or., in 1861. It was on Judge Riddle's land that the Southern Pacific train was robbed July 15, 1886, and it was Judge Riddle's son-in-law, G. K. Quine, who tracked Case down and caught his arm.

Case made his appearance about Roseburg and other towns in that vicinity some time during 1886. He carried a rifle and a revolver, and had been confined in the penitentiary for attempting to rob a Chinese man. It was in this attempt that he was shot in the hand, which was maimed for two years in the penitentiary at Salem, and while confined there met one of the Poolers, who was then in the Southern Pacific train which was held up in July, 1886. Being a hard character, and associated with the Pooler, he was suspected, and, along with the Pooler, was run down by my son-in-law, G. K. Quine, in the northern part of California, and the superior court, but gave bonds, only to be held as United States prisoner for robbing the train. At that time he was guilty by the jury, but Judge Bellinger set the verdict aside and allowed the robbers to go free. Their trial before the circuit court never came up, being postponed from time to time.

Some time after the first holdup I received a letter from Case, in which he begged me to let him out of the penitentiary, and see him or suffer the consequences. I was a witness in the trial against him, but he never came up. I suppose he had it in for me on account of being tracked down by my son-in-law. He was a hard character, and considerable stock, etc. Whether Case should receive a pardon is another question.

How did he comb his hair down there? Why, he parted it down over his forehead, and he had a comb in his pocket. Before leaving home for Tacoma yesterday someone told me to look on the top of his head, and I found that he had a comb in his pocket, and sure enough there they were. The last time I saw Case was about ten days ago, when he was in the penitentiary. He was bound home, but where he went I don't know.

Is anyone about Roseburg know of Case's whereabouts? Well, really, I don't know, unless it would be the Pooler, who seemed to be his partner in the robbery. People about Roseburg and throughout that portion of Oregon generally are not keeping over a departure to another place without saying so.
