VOTE BREAKS UP PARTY LINES.

Senator Vest's Motion to Place White Pine on the Free List Defeated, 20 to 28—Eight Democrats Vote Against It and Three Republicans for It—The Ballot Preceded by a Breezy Debate, Which at Times Evoked Roars of Laughter—Future Programme Announced—Amendments to the Sugar Schedule Will Be Submitted.

WASHINGTON, June 7.—The senate today disposed of the lumber paragraph, which has been more stubbornly contested than any feature of the bill thus far, by defeating the motion of Senator Vest to place white pine on the free list, yeas 20, nays 28.

IN THE HOUSE.

The Opposition Triumphs, But is Downed on Roll Call.

WASHINGTON, June 7.—Bailey of Texas, the minority leader, was in his seat at 10 o'clock on Monday morning, the first time in a fortnight. On motion of Dinwiddie of Arkansas the senate resolution to permit Carlos Gutierrez, of Salvador, to be received as a cadet at West Point, Texas, was adopted, and on motion of Morris of Minnesota the senate bill to amend the act for constructing a steel bridge across the St. Louis river was passed.

Senator Quay's Amendments.

WASHINGTON, June 7.—Senator Quay gave notice today of several amendments he proposed to offer to the tariff bill. One of these provided for striking out the prohibition against the increase of the beer tax. The free admission of iron ore imported from mines owned abroad by citizens of the United States for their use is also provided for.
