KING COUNTY VALUES.

ASSESSMENT FOR 1936 COMPARED WITH THAT FOR 1937.

Comparative Table Compiled by Bradner A. Knapp in the County Assessor's Office Shows a Total Increase of Nearly Five and a Half Million Dollars—in Seattle alone the Difference Between the Two Years Stands Out in the Figures \$3,469,404—Other Features of the Exhibit.

The assessed values of property, real and personal, in Seattle and King county will form an instructive basis for meditation among people who have been possessed with the idea that last year was one of depression.

Equally striking is the increase shown in the valuation of the property in the county at large, including that within the city limits.

A valuable feature of the exhibit is that it shows precisely the valuation, real and personal, in the extensions which have been made to the city.

The value of the tide lands within the city limits for 1937 is put down at \$4,242,500. The total personal property assessment within the city limits, or more properly within the extension of the city limits, was for 1936, \$75,687, for 1937, \$82,800.
