WHEAT ON THE BOOM.

Dollar Mark Touched Amid Wild Excitement.

FOREIGN DEMAND THE CAUSE.

Overestimated of European Crops Send the Price Climbing Upstairs Amid the Wild Bores of Rampant Bulls—The Head Plays in Minneapolis to Celebrate—An Even Higher Price is Predicted.

CHICAGO, Aug. 20.—The wheat market has another remarkable advance today, September closing at 90c and December at 92c, showing gains of 5/8c and 5/16c respectively. There was a sensational advance at Liverpool, and Liverpool was responsible for the jump, which was accompanied by scenes of excitement almost unparalleled. On the curb this afternoon September wheat sold at 90c, corn advanced 1/2c in spite of unfavorable conditions, and oats closed 1/2c higher. Provisions advanced 1/16c.
