

FORD PLACED UNDER ARREST

Deposed Minister Faces a Criminal Charge

WARRANT ISSUED YESTERDAY.

Says His Case Was Railroaded at the Everett Trial—Hill of Two Mysterious Women and Attempted Blackmail—The Minister Not Yet Ready to Make a Statement—His Friends Stand by Him.

Rev. W. T. Ford, formerly pastor of the Madison street Methodist Episcopal church, was arrested yesterday afternoon by Constable Pike at the entrance of the Burke block on Second avenue...

"No," replied Mr. Ford. "I do not care to be the authority for any statements at this time."

"Was all the evidence given in your behalf at the Everett conference published in the reports sent out?"

"This question caused Mr. Ford to answer emphatically: 'No.'"

He continued by saying that he had no complaint to make of the way in which he had been treated by the Post-Intelligencer, but as a matter of fact he did not have an opportunity to give his side of the case...
