EUROPE FILLED UP WITH WAR TALK.

Germany Intends to Hold Kiao Chau Bay.

TO USE AS NAVAL STATION

Marines Now Actively Engaged in Building Winter Quarters.

Great Britain Astonished at the Activity Shown by the Afridis, Who Are Far From Being Conquered—Bitter Cold Weather Hampers Military Operations—Russia Makes Ready to Collect War Indemnity From Turkey, and the Porte Is Compelled to Abandon Her Proposed Naval Reorganization Plans.

NOVACK'S VICTIM ALIVE IN SEATTLE.

The Yukon Fugitive May Not Be a Murderer.

MURRAY SEEN IN THIS CITY

He Talks With an Old Friend and Then Disappears Again.

Charles Wood, Recently From Vinton, Iowa, Is Approached by Edward Murray, of Watford, Iowa, Whom Frank Novack Is Supposed to Have Murdered Last February, and for Whose Murder Novack Is Now Being Tried in Iowa—The Police Searching for the Man—Wood Sure of Murray's Identity.

Charles Wood, of Vinton, Benton county, Iowa, walked into the police station late yesterday afternoon and made the startling announcement that he had seen and talked to Edward Murray, the man whom Frank Novack is supposed to have murdered in Benton county, Iowa.

Mr. Wood recently arrived from his home in Iowa, where he knew both Novack and Murray and was well acquainted with all the particulars of the supposed murder. To his utter astonishment on Friday evening he was approached by Murray, who shook hands with him warmly and talked pleasantly for a few minutes.


