TORPEDO SQUADRON NOT COMING.

Date of Departure from Cadix Indefinitely Postponed.

LONDON, March 8.—A letter received today from Madrid says: The Spanish torpedo squadron at Cadix will not sail for Cuba, owing to information received from the United States and Capt. Gen. Blanco. The Paris, in confirming the statement that the departure of the torpedo squadron has been indefinitely postponed, says: "It would not be surprising were the event closely connected with the recent visit of Gen. Woodford to Senor Gullon and Senor Sagasta."

SETTLING DEEP INTO THE MUD.

Much Doubt if Wreckers Can Save the Maine's Guns.

KEY WEST, March 8.—The tug Right Arm arrived from Havana this morning. Capt. Everett, diver of the Merritt & Chapman Company, who was on board, was very reserved concerning the work on the Maine. He expressed the opinion that it is doubtful if the big guns can be saved, so fast is the wreck sinking in the mud of Havana harbor.

WORKING NIGHT AND DAY.

WASHINGTON, March 8.—The Washington navy yard, where a large establishment is maintained by the government for the manufacture of guns and ordnance material, started work in three shifts, and the men are now working night and day on the big guns.

SALMON CANNERS COMBINE.

Will Receive Prices and Limit the Output.

VANCOUVER, B. C., March 8.—It has been known here for some time that the salmon cannery along the coast had entered into a combine, but no official announcement was made, because some large concerns kept out till the last moment. However, cannery men now come out boldly with the statement that they did not welcome last year's record pack, so a strong combination of cannery men and dealers has been entered into, the object being to regulate prices and judiciously limit the quantity of salmon to be put on this market.
