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CORBETT AND MCCOY FIGHT.

ARTICLES SIGNED BY REPRESENTATIVES FOR A 20-ROUND GO.

Will Meet September 10 at Buffalo for a \$20,000 Purse, All to Go to Winner—Both Have Gone into Training, Corbett at Asbury Park.

NEW YORK, July 15.—Articles of agreement, which will govern a twenty-round glove contest between J. J. Corbett and Kid McCoy were signed today at Constable's hotel by representatives of both men.

According to the agreement, the men will fight for a purse of \$20,000, winner to take all, before the Hawthorne Athletic Club, of Buffalo, N. Y., on the afternoon of September 10. If the weather be unfavorable or if a postponement be taken for some other reason, the meeting will take place some afternoon between September 10 and 19.

The men who affixed their signatures to the documents were McGraw, representing the club; Condit, on behalf of Corbett, and W. B. Gray for McCoy. William A. Brady was present when the articles were signed, and he insisted that the words "for the heavy-weight championship of the world" should be deleted. This was done, although McCoy will not claim the championship until after a meeting with Fitzsimmons.

Each of the principals, as well as the managers of the club, will deposit \$2,500 a week to bind the agreement. The stakeholder under the present agreement is Al Smith.
