BUILDING OF THE MISSOURI. Keel Laid For a Battleship That Will Be One of the Most Powerful On the Seas.

The ship was authorized by act of congress, approved May 1, 1898, and the contract for her construction was signed on the 11th of October following...

FASTEST YACHT EVER BUILT.

THE ARROW EXPECTED TO STEAM AT LEAST FIFTY MILES AN HOUR.

Millionaire Charles R. Flint is Constructing a Vessel That Will Have Phenomenal Speed—An Extraordinary Craft.

AT the shipbuilding yard of Samuel Ayres & Son, Nyack, N. Y., there is being constructed for Mr. Charles R. Flint, of New York, a long narrow-waisted racer which is expected to attain the phenomenal speed of fifty miles an hour.

The Arrow is to be launched early in May. She is to be ready for service by June 1. Ayres & Son are building the hull only. The Bethlehem Steel Company has the contract for fitting the machinery...

GRAVEYARD OF MANY SHIPS. Sable Island's Fight Against Inroads Made by the Sea.

The normal bunker capacity will be sixteen tons, but arrangements will be made by which fourteen extra tons can be stowed in compartments other than the bunkers...

The hull will weigh but twenty-two tons with the machinery. The Arrow is divided by six bulkheads into seven water-tight compartments. Eight feet abaft the bow is a collision bulkhead, which gives a storage space for fresh water...
