CHILKOOT TUNNEL PLANS.

COMPANY EXPECTS TO COMMENCE BORING NEXT JULY.

Permit to Begin Work, It is Anticipated, Will be Granted by British Columbian Parliament in June—Railroad Will Go to White Horse.
