Capt. Gilley Meets Death.

The next day when in the vicinity of Sledge island, fifteen or twenty miles off Nome, Capt. Gilley went on deck and seated himself on the rail of the vessel. A second later the boom swung around striking him. He tumbled over into the sea and drowned before assistance could reach him.

Capt. Gilley was 69 years old and a native of the Island of Bornoeo. He had been a resident of Alaska for nearly two decades. His fight with the Indians, in which ten are said to have been slain, occurred at Cape Prince of Wales.

RAILROADS WANT LABORERS

FOUR LINES HAVE RECRUITING OFFICERS IN SEATTLE.

Great Northern and Northern Pacific Have Already About 5,000 Men at Work in Washington-Eastern States' Construction Is Behind.

For two weeks past there has been no lessening in the demand for railroad laborers; neither has the supply increased. This is true, it is said by railroad contracting agents now in Seattle...

The present forces of the transcontinental line employed in Washington, it is estimated, foot up about 5,000 men. Of this number the Great Northern has about 3,000 at work on the Cascade and Everett tunnels...

On the divisions east of Washington it is estimated the Great Northern has 3,000 men and the Northern Pacific 2,000 to 3,000. Other lines in the Northwest, it is said, could readily use from 5,000 to 7,000 men from now to December 1, to say nothing of a large number more sought after by lines farther East.
