THE MAID OF SARAGOSSA.

This illustrious maiden exposed her life for her country at the memorable siege of Saragossa, in 1808. The French General Lefevre had been despatched by Bonaparte in the June of that year to reduce Saragossa, where the French standard of the Bourbons had been upraised.

The French had begun the siege in rather slothful style; they deemed much exertion unnecessary; 'Saragossa,' they said, 'was only inhabited by cowards and monks.' But their opinions and their efforts were destined to an entire revolution.

At this desperate moment an unknown maiden issued from the church of Nostra Donna del Pillas, habited in white raiment, a cross suspended from her neck, her hair disheveled, and her eyes sparkling with supernatural lustre.

The French, by their indomitable perseverance, from step to step, rendered themselves masters of nearly half the city. General Lefevre thought his hour of triumph had arrived--he sent to the Spanish Commandant, General Palafox, to demand a capitulation.
