

HUNGARY RATIFIES PEACE WITH ALLIES

National Assembly Agrees to Treaty Signed Last June.

EXPOSITION IS SILENT

Action Follows Demand of Powers for Immediate Consideration.

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Nov. 13.—The National Assembly has ratified the peace treaty signed by Hungary and the Allied and Associated Powers at the Great Trianon Palace, Versailles, on June 4 last. The opposition abstained from voting.

It was learned in Paris late in October that the Allies had sent a note to the Hungarian Government demanding ratification of the treaty of Trianon not later than November 16.

By the terms of the peace treaty this territory belongs to Hungary, but the Jugo-Slavs refuse to evacuate it. CIVIL WAR NEAR AS HUNGARIANS REVOLT

Only Intervention by Powers Will Save Situation.

Special Cable to THE NEW YORK HERALD. Budapest, Nov. 13.—The town of Puenfiterchen and the surrounding country, on the Hungarian frontier, are in rebellion. Civil war in Hungary is threatened unless the Powers intervene. By the terms of the peace treaty this territory belongs to Hungary, but the Jugo-Slavs refuse to evacuate it. The town of Puenfiterchen has become an asylum for political refugees from the Horthy Government in Budapest. Chief among these refugees are followers of Count Michael Karolyi, one-time Hungarian Premier.

Hungary, however, is preparing to occupy the district by force, for which it is gathering an army of 50,000. The people of the district, it was said, are preparing to resist, as they believe Admiral Horthy will bring with him a list of traitors and wholesale hangings will result when the Jugo-Slavs retire. The people of Puenfiterchen have sent a memorandum to the Entente, asking that the occupation by Admiral Horthy's forces be prevented and requesting recognition of the present officials.

Hungary also has made representations to the Entente against the Jugo-Slav occupation.

GREECE TO DECIDE ON NEW KING TO-DAY

Election Will Determine Return of Constantine or Rule of Venizelos.

ATHENS, Nov. 13 (delayed).—Demetrios Gounaris, former Premier and leader of the element supporting the return of former King Constantine to the throne of Greece, who is the opponent of Premier Venizelos in the elections to be held Sunday, has requested passports to Italy. If he fails to be elected his parliamentary immunity expires.

Gounaris, with the approval of M. Venizelos, was permitted to return to Greece to participate in the elections, although he was exiled during the war on the charge of high treason. His request for passports is regarded by supporters of Premier Venizelos as a significant indication of the trend of the forthcoming elections.

Sunday's election will decide whether Premier Venizelos will be returned to office and thereby be given a free hand in the selection of a new King or whether the Opposition as headed by Gounaris will restore to power former King Constantine.

Premier Venizelos is likely to have a big majority in the new provinces of Macedonia and Thrace and the islands, but in old Greece the struggle is a warm one.

England and France indicated their opposition to any government which would favor the return of Constantine. They claim the return of Constantine is the desire of the remaining German influence in Greece.

The Venizelos adherents charge that Gounaris has the full support of all pro-German influence.

While the country outwardly is calm, trouble is forecast after the election, as it will be a struggle with side winds. If Venizelos gets the majority of 270 of a total of 363, which his supporters claim, it is expected the Royalists will denounce the election as fraudulent. Should the Royalists win, the Venizelists have announced they will not accept the political dethronement of their chief.

The censorship, which ostensibly was removed last September, has again been put into force for foreign correspondents. In this connection it is recalled that on one occasion recently Minister of Foreign Affairs Politis announced that censorship of news sent by foreign correspondents did not exist, adding, "No civilized country which respects itself would maintain a censorship except for military matters."

19,621 IMMIGRANTS COME HERE IN WEEK

More than 14,000 immigrant aliens were inspected at the port of New York during the week just ended. Of these, 11,641 were steerage passengers inspected at Ellis Island, and 2,959 (estimated) were cabin passengers on incoming ships. There are 4,620 in port who have not been inspected yet, which brings the total arrivals for the week up to 19,621.

Thirteen hundred and nine are being detained, but 500 of these have passed the eligibility tests and are detained only temporarily until their relatives can be notified. Among those who will be deported are sixty-two anarchists and eight anarchists.




