WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—Preliminary figures on metal mining for 1920 in California, New Mexico, South Dakota and Texas were announced to-night by the Geological Survey and show that the metal mining industry generally was depressed in those States during the year.

Gold production in South Dakota in 1920 was \$4,338,000, compared with \$4,862,586 the previous year, and silver production amounted to 63,935 ounces, against 115,522 ounces in 1919.
