

**'LAST CARD LOUIS'
WINS LEGAL GAME**

Indictment Charging Him
With Cheating Is Dismissed
by Judge McIntyre.

REAL WIZARD AT POKER

Alleged to Have Cleaned Up
\$350,000 From Movie Men
and Garment Dealers.

When Louis Krohnberg, president of the Bijou Waist Company of 303 Fifth avenue, used to play stud poker with various other garment dealers and motion picture callboys he earned the sobriquet of "Last Card Louis" through his facility for winning with that particular card. These little private games ultimately landed Mr. Krohnberg before the bar of justice because of the allegation that he had cleaned up something like \$350,000 through the employment of what are known as "readers"; that is, cards that are so marked that one player is able to tell at a glance just what card it is that his opponent had turned face down upon the table.

Yesterday Mr. Krohnberg ran true to form, for on the last legal card of a series that he had played in an effort to secure the dismissal of the charges hanging over him he won, and the whole case was heard out of court. Judge John P. McIntyre, in General Sessions, dismissed the indictment returned against "Last Card Louis" on June 3, 1920, charging him with cheating.

"It is not an offence to play with marked cards," he wrote in rendering his decision. "It only becomes such when one uses them knowingly and with intent to cheat, or by making a false pretence, or by doing an act amounting to fraud. The evidence does not disclose that the defendant furnished the cards."

Whether this will dispose finally of the most famous poker case to make its way into local courts is a question, for Judge McIntyre's decision gives the District Attorney the right to a new deal. It permits him to resubmit the whole case to the Grand Jury. In his opinion covering thirty-six typewritten pages he holds that much of the evidence upon which Krohnberg was indicted was of a prejudicial character and improper.

CRIME COMMITTEE NAMED.
