

### SEIZED IN HIS PLANT AND ROBBED OF \$150

#### Paymaster Is Pounced Upon by Holdup Men When He Returns From Bank.

### BANK SUSPECT CAUGHT

#### Man Charged in \$140,000 Theft From Messenger Here Is Arrested in Chicago.

Albert Lepold, paymaster of the Auto Metal Produce Company, 432 East Seventy-first street, drew \$150 yesterday from an East Side bank, and while passing through the building on his return was seized by two men and dragged into a wash room. The men had no revolvers, but relied on their fists. They knocked Lepold down, took the money and ran out. When Lepold was able to get up he raised an outcry, but the men had disappeared.

A request was made yesterday for \$30,000 bail in the case of Frank Miller of 12 West Eighty-ninth street, who was arrested Friday when dining at the Ritz-Carlton. Peter Sabbatino, an Assistant District Attorney, pleaded for the large sum, but the amount was fixed at \$250. Counsel for Miller told Magistrate Harris that Miller was a member of an old New York family and there need be no fears that he would leave town.

Miller was charged with suspicion of grand larceny on an affidavit signed by Detective Edward J. Kaibfleisch, who said he had been informed that on October 9 last Miller stole American Express travellers' checks, Liberty bonds and other securities and an amount of cash, totalling about \$11,000. This information, according to the detective, came from Charles Fisher, an inspector of the American Express Company. Isaac Michaels, 472 West 2nd avenue, went on Miller's bond, handing to the

clerk of the court seven \$1,000 bills and one \$500 bill. Police Headquarters was notified yesterday of the arrest in Chicago of John Thompson, alias John Tiernan, charged with being implicated in the holdup of James McKenna, a messenger of the Chemical National Bank, December 12 last. Five thousand dollars in cash and \$149,000 in checks were taken. Thompson was arrested Friday night. He will be extradited.






