AQUITANIA GETS TYPHOUS BATH ON HER VOYAGE HERE
All Steerage Passengers Disinfected and Their Baggage Fumigated.
AVOID 5 DAY HOLDUP
Three Liners From Plague Zone Searched Yesterday at Quarantine.

10 NEW SLEEPING CASES
One Death in Staten Island Hospital—Disease Breaks in Pennsylvania.

The Cunard liner Aquitania, due here to-day from Southampton and Cherbourg, has been sterilized en route, according to a wireless despatch from her captain, Sir James Charles.

Dr. Royal S. Copeland, Health Commissioner, said that the fact that steamship companies were taking better care of their ships and passengers and immigrants arriving at the Battery in cleaner condition indicated the Government authorities are waking up.

Jewish and Italian interpreters will meet immigrants at Ellis Island beginning to-day and explain to them the reasons for the Health Department examination.

All Immigrants "Clean."
For the first time since the Health Department started its campaign against typhus, ten days ago, there were no verified infected persons among those examined at the Battery and railroad stations.

Dr. Copeland said that a new delousing plant has been established in the L. Have capable of handling 2,000 persons and that it will be the policy of the company to see that all passengers are clean before sailing for New York.

Naples, Feb. 21.—The steamer Caronia, which sailed for New York to-day, was to have taken 740 emigrants, but the emigration authorities forbade their embarkation because they had not been vaccinated.

DRUGGISTS OPPOSE NARCOTIC RULES

Hertrick by representatives of pharmaceutical societies from this and other cities throughout the State.

HETRICK'S UNION AIDS DENY THREATS
Chapman and Doran Testify They Never Conspired to Coerce Plumbers.

ELDER BEGINS DEFENCE

GREENWICH VILLAGE'S EDITORES FINED
Literary Effusion in Their Review Is Cause.

Once again the arm of the law has reached out in Greenwich Village, last week a City Magistrate threatened one Greenwich Village editor with the observation ward at Bellevue, and yesterday three justices in Special Sessions fined two other Greenwich Village editors or editors-in-chief \$50 each for the publication in their periodicals, The Little Review, of a literary effusion entitled "Ulysses."

The attorney, John Quinn, of 31 Nassau street, admitted that the style of the work was peculiar and striking, some of them regarded it as something in the nature of "cubist literature." He asserted, however, that its author, James Joyce, who was not in court, was a man of brilliant intellect, whose writings, some of them at least, had won the praise of such Titans as G. K. Chesterton and H. G. Wells; also that he was the author of a play, "The Invention of Solferino," which Justice John J. McInerney, however, said, "I think that this novel is unintelligent, and it seems to me like the work of a disordered mind."
