Eight nations were drawn for play in the first round the other four winning byes. As a diagram of the draw will tell at a glance just how the nations are coupled, and show what the possible combinations will be in the second and succeeding rounds of play, it is given here as follows:

It is pretty hard to figure at this moment what Canada, Australia and Japan and the Philippines will decide to do about their preliminaries.


