

HIS LOVE OF HOOTCH HIS CIRCUS SCANDAL

Call for 'Beer at Pier' Reveals Depravity of John Daniel of Congo, Africa.

SPURNS VOLSTEAD ACT Dexter Fellowes Lends 'Only' Gorilla Safe and Sober in the Garden.

In spite of the efforts made by a Mr. Dexter Fellowes, formerly a mineral water salesman of Pittsburgh, Mass., but now connected in some obscure way with the greatest show on earth and other places too numerous to mention, to keep the facts from press and public the news transpired late yesterday that the only gorilla in human captivity had landed in New York and was at home to the proletariat in Madison Square Garden.

Just what induced Mr. Fellowes to leave newspaper reporters in the dark as regards a really important piece of news of obvious publicity value to the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bay Circus is puzzling, as John Ringling, one of the principal owners of the circus, commented in a statement issued to the press last night. A possible explanation lies in the fact that the gorilla is addicted to drink, and Mr. Fellowes, who is very kind hearted, whatever may be said of him otherwise, may have surmised that John Daniel, which is the gorilla's name, would be in no condition when he came ashore to be interviewed by the keen young men of the press. An even more plausible motive for the astounding secrecy maintained is suggested by the radio received by the Ringlings on Monday night, a flash which read:

"Have beer at the pier."

Investigation shows that Mr. Fellowes tried to get a few bottles of real beer and that he was unsuccessful—the whole mission requiring secrecy, of course—and that he was able eventually to procure a small bottle of sherry and a similar quantity of old port wine.

Be these as they may, the United States mail steamship Old North Star, from British ports, had scarcely left Quarantine when Pier 14, North River, was simply jammed with alert news writers and camera men who awaited John Daniel's arrival and who peppered the palpably annoyed Mr. Fellowes with queries naturally of a most unbecomingly novel of the event. It was learned that the gorilla, which was taken in the Congo at the age of a few months, is now four years of age, stands 4 feet 4 inches tall and weighs 183 pounds.

"I have been kind enough to supply these facts, gentlemen," Mr. Fellowes said, "and I do hope you will refrain from mentioning the circumstance of John Daniel's love of booze. We understand from London that the creature simply must have his hootch or three or four times a day, and that, if he is not supplied, he will get very ill. It is not so serious a matter. Is that not so?"

"Quite so," Mr. Fellowes. Not one word said about the matter. The old North Star, which was then engaged in docking, and brushing Mr. Fellowes out of the way the reporters crowded aboard and sought John T. Benson, animal trainer for the Ringling Bros. of Hamburg, Germany, who brought the young gorilla to this country. Benson promptly exhibited John Daniel in a cage, but he was cagey and all that he had been said harshly about the personality of the great ape, for the newcomer to the circus appears to have a Pollyanna disposition and to be entirely content with his lot.

DESERTS BRIDE HIS MOTHER HAD FORCED HIM TO MARRY

Voight of Corona Refused to Keep Home and Went Home to Parent—Justice Strong Untangles Queer Case by Granting Annulment Decree.

Justice Selah B. Strong of the Supreme Court yesterday annulled the marriage of Mrs. Elizabeth Ida Voight of 7 Van Cleef street, Corona, to Robert Voight. The application was made by Mrs. Voight on the grounds that she had been deceived by Voight. She testified that he told her before the marriage that he owned a house at 43 South Junction avenue, and that as soon as they were married he would fly up a home for her at that place. Relying on this promise, she consented to be married to him on January 24, 1920.

Mrs. Voight testified that she had been going with Voight for about six years before their marriage and she had been engaged to him for about a year and a half. She had prepared a number of things for the household and had bought considerable furniture. The wedding was held at the home of her father, Otto Reinke, and was attended by all the members of her family and by all the members of Voight's family with the exception of his father.

The ceremony was performed by the Rev. John E. Kelly, pastor of the Episcopalian Church of Corona. After the marriage everybody congratulated them.

COP SAVES DROWNING RESCUER AND HIS CHUM Game of Tag on Recreation Pier Almost a Tragedy.

A game of tag on the recreation pier that juts into the East River from Thomas Jefferson Park, near 112th street, almost ended in a tragedy yesterday when Nicholas Cuzzo, 28 East 112th street, slipped through the railing and fell into the water. He was unable to swim, and when his cries for help reached the other side he was thirty feet from the pier and was being carried toward midstream.

Louis Cuzzo, 15, of 326 East 113th street, whose length of rope and the end of it to him, Young Macchio was too frightened to stop struggling long enough to grab the line, and an instant later he sank. GOT \$13,000 IN SIGHT OF KILROE, SAYS WOMAN

Mrs. Bourasse Tells of Settlement in Bigamy Case.

Mrs. Helen Montrose St. Marie Bourasse, whose charge of bigamy against her husband, Napoleon A. Bourasse, broker, was dropped in the Tombs Court, and in consequence of which Edwin P. Kilroe, Assistant District Attorney, was indicted for failure to prosecute, was the principal witness yesterday when the trial of Mr. Kilroe and Louis E. Swartz, her attorney in the bigamy case, was resumed before Supreme Court Justice Weeks.

She described herself as a film actress. She and Bourasse were married in Brooklyn in 1918, and six months later when she learned that he had been married to Mary Coyne in 1916, she consulted Swartz and Edward H. Berger, formerly her attorney, who decided to prosecute, she said. Soon after she continued, she and Swartz met Mr. Kilroe in a restaurant. He did not seem interested in the case, she said, until Mr. Swartz pressed him a slip of paper, upon reading which he said he thought prosecution would be possible.

Joseph H. Proskauer, of counsel for the defendant gave to the court's keeping in envelope, which he said contained this slip of paper, adding that it set forth the details of the Montrose and Coyne marriages. The witness said that she was not certain of the suggestion from Swartz that she settle the case for \$10,000, as she wanted to "clear her name," but that he persisted in advising a settlement. She testified he told her "Mr. Kilroe could have the case postponed indefinitely."

When Magistrate Mancuso allowed the prosecution to drop the case on November 19, 1919, he testified, representative of Mr. Bourasse handed her \$13,000 in an envelope. The transaction took place in the court room. Mr. Kilroe was just outside the door, but where he could see it, she said.

3 YEARS FOR 200 BAD CHECKS.
