ALLIES DISAPPROVE OF GREEK ADVANCE

Commissioners Tell Sultan They Are Not Abetting Movement.

DUB IT POLITICAL FOLLY Nationalists East of Smyrna Reported to Have Defeated the Greeks.

CONSTANTINOPLE, March 25.—Visits have been made to the Sultan by the Allied commissioners to officially notify him of the changes in the Serres treaty. The commissioners pointed out that their countries had worked hard in favor of Turkey. When asked by the Sultan why the Greek offensive had been permitted, they denied that their governments were approving or abetting the movement.

While local Greeks declare the offensive will give them Constantinople and that they will celebrate their Easter in the mosque of Saint Sophia, there are many condemnations of the offensive by the Allies as an indication of the madness spreading over the Orient, making a solution of its problems impossible.
