

**PATIENT'S HAMMER
KNOCKS OUT DOCTOR**

**Lexington Avenue Physician
Attacked in Office as Back
Is Turned.**

ASSAILANT THEN ESCAPES

**Man Had Undergone Treat-
ment and Had Returned
With 'Pains in Head.'**

Dr. Nishan H. Bayenderian, 56 years old, a physician well known among Armenians in this city, was attacked in his office at 44 Lexington avenue yesterday afternoon by a man who drew a small hammer from his inside coat pocket and began striking the doctor on the head. The first blow landed just above the right eye and Dr. Bayenderian toppled over. The man struck several more blows while the physician tried to get to his feet. Dr. Bayenderian's cries attracted the attention of tenants in the house and a fireman approached the man fled. The physician was found unconscious and was taken to Bellevue Hospital. There were severe bruises on his scalp and face. He described his assailant as a patient who had been receiving treatment, but had declared his inability to pay for it. When the man called yesterday he repeated that he had no funds, and Dr. Bayenderian suggested that if he wished he could go to one of the city clinics. The man left, but returned some time later. "I've got some money now, doctor," he said. "I want you to give me something for pains in the head." The doctor told him to sit down and

turned toward a medicine cabinet, when the man drew the hammer and struck the doctor over the eye. Police were searching for the man last night.

BORDER HUNTERS WARNED.
