MARRIAGE DELAYED, GIRL, 19, TOOK POISON, IS HIS DEFENCE

Prospective Bridegroom Held, Declares He Tried to Prevent Her From Killing Herself at Their Trysting Place.

CORUNNA, Mich., April 3.—That Lucy Whorton, 19-year-old Durand girl, took her life when told their marriage was to be delayed last Wednesday night, was the statement made to Shiawassee county authorities to-day by Forrest Higgins, 22, who is held here on a charge of murder in connection with the girl's death, according to R. E. Matthews, prosecutor.
