

12 SHOTS FAIL TO HOLD UP THIEVES

Robbers Steal Woman Spiritualist's Car With \$10,150 in Cash and Gems.

SHE CHASES IN MOTOR

Another Machine Causes Criminals to Run Automobile Against Hydrant.

THEY ESCAPE ON FOOT

Stolen Property Recovered—Mrs. Finley Thinks Spirit Plane May Have Helped.

A dozen shots were fired last night during a chase through Madison street and Marcy avenue, Brooklyn, following an attempt to steal an automobile and \$10,150 in jewelry and money belonging to Mrs. Marie B. Finley, spiritualist, of 174 Madison street.

According to Mrs. Finley's story to Vollecan Donion and Kennedy of the Gates avenue station, she returned to her home about 10 o'clock to get a coat. She had been making several professional calls and had others to make, but felt she needed the coat. She left the automobile standing in front of the house and as she alighted dropped her handbag containing \$10,000 worth of jewelry and \$150 in bills to the floor in the forward part of the machine.
