

COLOMBIAN TREATY HAS 6 VOTE MARGIN

Senate Passage Wednesday Forecast Under Agreement.

SALES TAX TO FAIL, ASSERTS MONDELL

Congress Will Not Pass Bill, as Floating Debt Must Be Refunded, He Says.

WASHINGTON, April 16.—In the first week of the extra session of Congress the House passed the emergency tariff bill, while the Senate discussed the Colombian treaty, under agreement to vote Wednesday on the question of ratification. Leaders declared it would be ratified by a margin of half a dozen votes. Delayed somewhat by lack of committee organization, the big legislative programme will be taken up with a rush next week, with the Immigration bill, as vetoed by Mr. Wilson, having right of way in the House. The Knox peace resolution and the emergency tariff are awaiting consideration by the Senate. The Knox measure is to be taken up Wednesday by the Foreign Relations Committee with plans for an immediate report. Chairman Lodge said today he hoped to begin debate late next week, probably after settlement of the dispute over committee reorganization. Long discussion of the Knox resolution is not anticipated by Senate leaders. A number of Democratic Senators are expected to vote for it. The Emergency Tariff bill is to be taken up Monday by the Senate Finance Committee, which will begin limited hearings Tuesday. Chairman Penrose believes it will be impossible, however, to report the bill to the Senate until late in the week. After passing the immigration bill the House will begin work on the army and navy bills. Estimates by Secretary Weeks for an army of 175,000 are to be transmitted Monday to Chairman Good of the Appropriations Committee. The Senate Judiciary Committee will meet Monday for organization and is expected to consider the question of loans to the Allies. Abstracts of documents submitted to the committee by former Secretary Houston, containing all information regarding allied commitments and advances, are ready for the committee's consideration. The Senate was in session only an hour today and the House had an off day.

The floating debt of the United States must be refunded before long term obligations if taxes are to be reduced materially and not merely shifted during this session of Congress. Representative Mondell (Wyo.), Republican leader, declared today. His announcement is understood to represent the almost unanimous view of Republican leaders of the House. Mr. Mondell asserted that already the American people have paid a much greater percentage of their war debt than other nations and that these payments should be slowed up so that greater reductions in taxation may be made. It is generally recognized that this policy must be followed in regard to the floating debt and that the Victory notes which mature in 1923 must be refunded into long term bonds if any considerable reduction in taxation is made. Mr. Mondell indicated that the Republican leaders favor allowing the floating debt, represented in its entirety by Treasury certificates of indebtedness, to run along until the Victory notes mature in 1923 and then make one general refunding. The Republican leader estimated that by July 1 Treasury certificates of indebtedness outstanding will be about \$1,500,000,000. "There will not be a sales tax passed at this session for two reasons," said Mr. Mondell. "First, a sales tax cannot be justified except as an emergency measure, and second, the country needs and is demanding a lifting and not a shifting of the tax burden. Therefore there should be no additional taxes. The country is not getting back to a pre-war basis, but to a post-war basis, and the time has come when the floating debt must be considered as part of the war debt and treated as such. Then, I am convinced that the excess profits and other taxes regarded as unnecessary and injurious to proper and legitimate business can be repealed without addition of any new taxes."

"CONSCIENCE" \$1 TO HARDING.
WASHINGTON, April 17.—President Harding started a "conscience fund" of his own to-day in a dollar remitted by an unidentified person in Pasadena, Cal., who wrote that it represented an amount of which Mr. Harding was "robbed" twenty years ago. "About twenty years ago," the letter said, "the writer robbed you of forty cents worth of property. Please accept enclosed for amount and interest, and let the writer remain unknown." The President said he would keep the dollar as a fund similar to that carried by the Treasury Department for remittances from conscience stricken defrauders of the Government.

SALESMEN URGE SALES TAX.
Two thousand travelling salesmen, members of the National Council of Travelling Men's Associations, met last night for a smoker and entertainment in the grand ballroom of the Hotel Astor. Julius S. Bachs made a speech advocating the sales tax, and as soon as he sat down two dozen messenger boys came into the room and distributed telegraph blanks. Each man wrote a message to his Representative in Washington protesting against the present system of taxation and urging that the sales tax be given a trial.


