Twelve Leading Job Houses Sign Agreement of an Arbitrator.
WAGE IS CUT \$4.35
Reduction Affects 12,000 Men in the Four Major Crafts.

MEAT PROFITEERS CHECK CONSUMPTION
Prices Charged Not in Any Way Justified, Says Everett C. Brown.

Meat prices now being charged by retailers represent profiteering to the greatest degree the country ever has known and are not in any way justified by wholesale prices, the National Live-stock Exchange declared to-day in a report submitted to the House Agricultural Committee by its president, Everett C. Brown. The report was submitted in opposition to the packer control legislation.

BUILDING CHIEF FOR WAGE ADJUSTMENT
Hutcheson Expresses Willingness to Recognize Reduction of Living Costs.
CINCINNATI, May 5.—Practically all the building trades unions throughout the country are willing to submit the question of wage reductions to arbitration, William Hutcheson, president of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America, announced to-night after a meeting of the executive council of the building trades department of the American Federation of Labor.

Compromise Is Below New Schedule Formulated for May 1.
Special Despatch to THE NEW YORK HERALD, Chicago, May 5.—The job printing strike was ended to-day when twelve of the leading firms signed the agreement formulated by an arbitrator reducing the weekly working time four hours and the weekly pay \$4.35. The printers had accepted the agreement. Prof. Ralph Emerson Hellman, dean of the School of Commerce of Northwestern University, made the compromise proposal in his status as arbitrator.

DROP IN WORKERS EMPLOYED IN APRIL
Unemployment Increase Is Four-tenths of One Per Cent. in Month.
WASHINGTON, May 5.—Unemployment throughout the country increased four-tenths of 1 per cent. during April, according to figures made public to-night by the Department of Labor. A decrease of 7,087 workers from the payrolls of 1,424 firms in sixty-five principal industrial centres, normally employing 501 or more, or a total of 1,600,000, was shown by the Labor Department statistics. Since January these firms have let out almost 50,000 employees, or 2.9 per cent.

FIGHT RAIL PAY CUT BEFORE U. S. BOARD
Chiefs of Brotherhoods Say Reductions Will Not Solve Present Problem.
CHICAGO, May 5.—Wage reductions will not solve the nation's transportation problems, representatives of the Big Four brotherhoods declared before the United States Railroad Labor Board to-night in their fight against proposed cuts in the payroll of train service men on eleven railroads. Labor was the most available thing to pounce upon when retrenchment was necessary, declared L. E. Sheppard, head of the conductors, but, while the employees were sympathetic, he said, they "were not Abraham's and have no Isaac to sacrifice."

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INDIANAPOLIS, May 5.—Approximately 8,000 members of the International Typographical Union are on strike because of the failure of employing book and job printers to accede to the demands for a forty-four hour week, John McFarland, president of the union, said to-night.

DETROIT, Chicago, Toledo and Passaic showed the greatest numerical gains in employment, but in the percentage of gain Denver, Detroit, Toledo and Passaic led in the order named, with Chicago far down the list.
Ten cities reporting largest decreases in employment during April were: Johnstown, Pa., 20.9 per cent.; Youngstown, Ohio, 18.4; Pittsburgh, 16.9; Portland, Ore., 16.7; Seattle, 16.6; St. Paul, 13.7; New Orleans, 13.2; Omaha, 11.8; San Francisco, 10.9; and Chattanooga, 8.9.

General chairman representing 100,000 members of the United Brotherhood of Maintenance of the Way Employees and Shop Laborers in the Eastern district met in the Hotel Alcazar yesterday to discuss the Railway Labor Board's recommendations for a new working agreement to be signed July 1. The board's sixteen points were endorsed, and it is expected the union will proceed to negotiate individual agreements with each road based upon them and upon local conditions.
