

SERVICES ON PIER FOR U. S. WAR DEAD

Bodies of 1,225 Brought From France by Transport Somme for Burial at Home.

Three memorial services for the dead of the First, Second and Twenty-seventh divisions, in which chaplains of many religious denominations united, were held yesterday on pier 4, Hoboken, in honor of the 1,225 dead brought to port Friday by the transport Somme.

On the great pier, a thousand feet long, hundreds of coffins were ranged in rows. Other caskets lay in the hold of the transport alongside. For the ceremonies there were present 300 soldiers of the First Division, now at Camp Dix; Salvation Army girls, a guard of honor of 300 men from New York units, men of the Second Division Post of the American Legion and Belleau Woods Post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, many officers still in the service and about 60 relatives of the dead men.

"It is fitting that they should return to their native land that their lives may be an inspiration to our people to be worthy of them; to stand ready as they stood, and to be ready, if necessary, to give their lives for our country and flag," said Major-Gen. Charles R. Sumner, commander of the First Division.

"Their sacrifice will make us all stronger and make us live more worthily as citizens. These silent forms cannot fail to quicken our national conscience and our sense of duty to ourselves and to our nation."

Among the bodies on the pier were those of Col. Bertram T. Clayton, Q. M. C.; Col. Hamilton A. Smith, Twenty-sixth Infantry; Lieut.-Col. John M. Craig, Sixteenth Infantry, and Major Edwin R. Kimble, First Engineers.

"The greatest tribute I can pay these men is that they did not fall their rendezvous with death," Chaplain Edward Hazard, who served overseas with the Twenty-seventh Division, said of the men of his organization.

Hanson of the Twenty-third Regiment, N. Y. N. G., Brooklyn; Chaplain James Costello, Francis McCaffery, Daniel Clifford and Rabbi Forefinger, Deputy Police Commissioner Rodman Wanda-maker, Grover Whalen and John H. Sinnott, secretary to Mayor Hylan.

Music was furnished by a military band and the New York Fire Department band. Arrangements will be made to-morrow for relatives for the removal of the bodies.

RUNAWAY WRECK MOTOR CAR; FOUR HURT

Three May Die After Collision at Base of Hill.

A runaway horse, harnessed to a junk wagon, crashed into an automobile at Palisades avenue and the Elm street hill, Yonkers, late yesterday, causing probably fatal injuries to three persons, one of them an infant. The animal was so badly hurt he had to be shot.

The injured, all of whom are residents of Yonkers, included Miss Rose Lyons, 22 of Jones place; Frank Turner, 33 of 182 Ridge avenue; Kenneth Turner, 2, his son and William Whalen, 41 of 189 Riverdale avenue. All were taken to St. John's Riverside Hospital. Turner and Miss Lyons suffered fractures of the skull and internal injuries and it was said they could not live. The baby also was seriously hurt and was unconscious. Whalen escaped with a few scratches.

Whalen, alone in the junk wagon, lost control of the horse at the top of the hill. The animal sped down the incline at such speed that it was impossible for the automobile to be steered out of his path. One of the shafts of the wagon was splintered by the collision and the end of it struck Miss Lyons on the head. She fell against Turner and the baby and all dropped into the roadway. The wreckage of the wagon and the automobile fell on top of them.
