

**WIFE OF SOLDIER  
SLAIN BY ADMIRER**

Mexican Whose Attention  
She Had Spurned Then  
Ends Own Life.

Mrs. Laura Lux, 19, wife of a soldier living in 229 East Seventy-second street, was shot and killed yesterday morning by Ambrose Returelo, a rejected suitor, as she was entering the loft building in 29 West Thirty-sixth street, where she was employed as a hat frame operator. Returelo fired four shots into the body of the young woman, two of them as she lay in the street pleading

for her life, and then turned the weapon on himself. He died in Bellevue Hospital a few hours later. From what the police have been able to learn it appears Mrs. Lux had been living in fear of Returelo for several months. She had him arrested last Monday on an assault charge when he eluded the fire escape of her home and demanded she let him in. Returelo was held in Yorkville prison until Wednesday because he twice refused to stop annoying Mr. Lux. He was a Mexican, had been working as a laborer, and lived in 1883 Lexington avenue.

Returelo called at the factory where Mrs. Lux was working Friday afternoon and learned she was still employed there. When the young woman started to enter the building yesterday morning she was confronted by the Mexican, who had a pistol in his hand. She screamed and ran to the street with Returelo in pursuit. He fired two shots at the woman as she ran to the south side of the street, and then two more as she lay on the sidewalk pleading with him to spare her. Returelo fired the fifth shot

through his forehead and fell beside the young woman. Two of the shots shattered windows near by. Detectives learned that a woman following closely the description of Mrs. Lux lived with Returelo at the Lexington avenue house for three months. Mrs. Lux was married when she was 15 years old and leaves a son, 4 years old.

**ENDS LIFE IN HEARING  
OF MOTHER'S DEATH**  
Michael J. Rogan, 28, of 105 East 134th street, stayed in the home of his sister, Mrs. Edward Orless, at 222 East Sixty-seventh street, Friday night, and yesterday morning Mrs. Orless had a letter from Ireland announcing the death there of her mother from natural causes. Rogan went to the parlor window and knelt in prayer. Then he rose suddenly and leaped out of the window. He was killed in the fall of four stories. The police believe he became suddenly crazed by grief.
