

PNEUMATIC TUBES FAVORED FOR MAI

Congressional Commission Told They Are Necessary to Post Office.

ARGUE ABOUT SITES Expansion at Thirty-third Street West Advocated for General Plant.

SOLUTIONS ARE OFFERED Second Class Facilities Are Described as Inadequate to Care for Business.

Two post office problems vital to New York interests were considered at the hearing held yesterday in the Hotel Pennsylvania before the Joint Congressional Postal Commission...

Among those who are extensive users of the mail and who spoke for the extension of the present main post office site were Frederic W. Hume, executive secretary of the National Publishers Association...

Speaking against the Queens site, Mr. Sheehan said the truck haul across the Queensboro Bridge would add thousands of dollars a month to the mailing costs of the companies he represents...

Mr. Follmer, who spoke for the Merchants Association, and who for many years was New York's assistant superintendent of mails, now has charge of the mail service of the Guaranty Trust Company...

Mr. Lelper said the railroad at present handles 550 tons of mail a day, necessitating the use of forty cars, but the increase in mail, as estimated by the mail service and traffic division, is expected to be 830 tons per day in 1930...

For the National Publishers' Association a statement filed by Mr. Hume described the present second class mailing facilities as wholly inadequate and showed that 20 per cent. of the total weight of all magazines and newspapers mailed in the United States goes from this city...

Mr. Crocker, supervisor of traffic for the New York Central Railroad, spoke in favor of a site from Ninth to Tenth avenue and between Twenty-ninth and Thirtieth streets...

Merton L. Emerson, president of the New York Pneumatic Tube Company, which installed and operated the pneumatic mail tubes, now discontinued, said that if the Government wished to resume the tube service the plant should be taken over and operated by Government employes...
