FORGIVE AND FORGET, KING'S PLEA TO IRISH. Ruler Urges Both Factions to Put Out Hand of Fellowship to All.

BELFAST, June 22.—King George, accompanied by Queen Mary, came to Ireland to-day, opened the Northern Parliament with a plea for the two factions to end their strife and forgive and forget, and left amid cheering thousands with no untoward incident to mar the historic ceremony.

King Pleads for Peace. Amid a setting in which the formal pomp and ceremony of the most colorful pageantry vied with spontaneous enthusiasm, the King, in a clear, strong voice, made his plea for peace.

When the day dawned the streets were already jammed, seeming to indicate that all the people of the six counties were here. Apart from the guards and the improvised barricades, the military kept in the background, except those in brilliant uniforms who acted as an escort to the Sovereigns.

Irish Peace This Week, Insists Sir John Frasier. ROCHESTER, N. Y., June 22.—Sir John Foster Frasier of Edinburgh, Scotland, speaking last night in Webster, near here, predicted that "something would happen on Thursday to end the rioting and rebellion in Ireland."

Follows Westminster Programme. The ceremonies as far as possible followed the lines of the opening of Parliament at Westminster. There was an official luncheon at the City Hall given by Prime Minister Sir James Craig.

3 ARMED MEN CAUGHT BY POLICE OF BELFAST. 'God Save King' Removed; Union Jacks Torn Down. BELFAST, June 22.—The police in the Upper Falls district, hearing firing in that area to-day, pursued eight men they suspected and captured three of them, who were found to have ammunition in their possession.

THREE MAGISTRATES IN IRELAND ARE KIDNAPPED. Two Murders Are Reported From County Cork. DUBLIN, June 22.—Three magistrates were kidnapped last night and to-day. They are C. S. King of Bandon, who was taken away Tuesday night, and J. S. Gillman and James Fitzpatrick, both of Clonakilly, who were seized this morning.

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U. S. STILL IN DARK ON JAPANESE PACT. State Department Denies It Is Kept Informed of Progress by Great Britain.

NEW YORK, June 22.—More than usual significance attaches to an official statement issued by the State Department to-day denying the report published that the United States is being kept informed of the progress of the negotiations between Great Britain and Japan for renewal of the Anglo-Japanese alliance.

During the night four Union Jacks which had been hoisted over the Municipal Building in Londonderry, and banners bearing the words "God Save the King" were removed in accordance with the declaration made at the time of his election by the Nationalist Lord Mayor O'Doherty that no emblem of any description would be permitted during his term of office.

EIGHT MEMBERS OF JAPANESE DIET HERE. World Tour Includes Allies in the World War. A Japanese parliamentary party, made up of eight members of the Japanese Diet and travelling for the purpose of studying political and commercial conditions in the countries with which Japan was allied in the war, reached this city yesterday in the course of a journey which will take it through England, France and Italy and back to Japan by way of India.

PREPARING FOR BIG DIRIGIBLE. Mammoth Aircraft, Purchased by U. S., Ready for Trial. LONDON, June 22.—Three American naval officers and six men who have completed a course of airship training at Howden now are en route to the United States, where they will assist in the preparations for the landing of the ZR-2, the mammoth British built dirigible hitherto known as the H-18, which has been purchased by the United States and will be flown to America next autumn.

PEKIN IS SUSPICIOUS OF JAPAN ON SHANTUNG. Sees No Reason to Negotiate Directly With Tokio. PEKIN, June 22.—China believes there is no occasion for opening negotiations with Japan relative to the restoration of China of the Shantung peninsula, and regards with suspicion Japan's suggestions in this direction, according to Dr. W. W. Yen, Chinese Minister of Foreign Affairs.

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ENVOY TO JAPAN CHOSEN. WASHINGTON, June 22.—President Harding is understood to have chosen as Ambassador to Japan a man whose name has not been brought into public discussion of possible appointees.

OPPOSE ANGLI-JAP TREATY. MELBOURNE, Australia, June 23.—At a conference to-day of the Australian Labor party a resolution was adopted protesting against a renewal of the Anglo-Japanese treaty, "or any purely military or secret treaty containing the germs of future warfare."

QUIRINAL AND VATICAN RECONCILIATION URGED. ROME, June 22.—Professor Benito Mussolini, former Socialist leader, who went over to the Fascist, or Extreme Nationalist, in the Chamber of Deputies to-day expressed himself as favorable to a reconciliation between the Vatican and the Italian Government, remarking that the development of Catholicism throughout the world was leading hundreds of millions of men to look upon Rome as the centre of the universe.

RHINELAND SOLDIERS PROFIT FROM COCAINE. PARIS, June 22.—Soldiers on leave of absence from the Rhineland form one of the principal agencies for the introduction of cocaine into France, according to a declaration made to-day by Dr. Maurice Courtois-Suffit at a meeting of the Academy of Medicine.
