In a fit of temporary insanity, it is believed, caused by the heat and by continued illness, Mrs. Jane Shaw Riker, wife of William Riker, Jr., and a leader in Orange society, shot herself yesterday in her home, 147 Cleveland street, Orange, N. J., dying almost instantly. Mrs. Riker, who was 64 years old, had been ill for several years with nervous trouble, and was under the care of a nurse. Her body was not found till some time after she died, as no one heard the shot.

The Riker home is one of the show places of Orange. Mrs. Riker was known as a leader in Republican politics in Essex county, is a manufacturing jeweler, a partner in the firm of Riker Brothers at 42 Court street, Newark. Mrs. Riker was a member of the Women's Club and most other Orange social organizations. Just when Mrs. Riker ended her life is not known. Her nurse, Theresa Bergin, lay down for a nap after lunch, and at that time Mrs. Riker was quiet and showing no signs of mental disturbance. She was quietly wrapped herself in a kimono, presented a revolver and slipped into a bathroom, closing the door. She then placed the muzzle of the revolver in her mouth and pulled the trigger. The bullet took an upward course lodging near her temple.
