The corrected reading of the barometer (reduced to sea level) at New York on Saturday, July 9, 1921, at 5 AM, as reported by the United States Weather Bureau, was twenty-nine and ninety hundredths (29.90) inches. This closely approximates seven hundred and fifty-nine and five-tenths (759.5) millimeters. Captains of all vessels now lying in or near the ports of New York and Brooklyn can advantageously use the above official data for observing whether their own barometers require any considerable correction or adjustment. MARITIME MISCELLANY.

Bark Astor (Dan), which arrived at this port yesterday from Copenhagen, reported that on June 11, when the vessel was off Newfoundland Banks, struck an iceberg, damaging her bow. Str Lorain, from Baltimore and Port Arthur, str Manila, do, which arrived at Cristobal June 20, struck the bank of the Panama Canal, damaging starboard bow. The Lorain will be delayed several days making temporary repairs. The Iron Steamboat Co has put in operation an afternoon boat to Rockaway Beach on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, leaving West 12th street at 4:15 and from pier 1, North River, at 2:15 P M. A return boat leaves Rockaway Beach at 3:30 P M. Str Mopang, which struck a mine July 5 while entering Burgess Harbor in the Black Sea and later sank, was not under charter to the Export Steamship Corporation of New York as previously reported, but was operated for the United States Shipping Board by the Bull Steamship Co of New York. LONDON, July 9—Schr Lavinia St Snow, New York for Swana Island, coal, collided with lighthouse tender Asialia off Pollock Rip lighthouse in heavy fog yesterday and the Asialia is badly crippled and was towed to New Bedford to-day by naval dredge Navasink, schooner lighthouse tender in crash and disappeared in fog; lighthouse officials endeavoring to locate her; tender now undergoing repairs and will be put in commission immediately. LONDON, July 9—Str Daniel Webster, New Orleans, do, for Greece, has arrived at St Michaels with boiler tubes leaking. MOBILE, Ala, July 9—Str San Cristobal

(Mex), repairing, oil in bilges took fire from unknown cause; fire extinguished; slight damage to steamer. NEW ORLEANS, July 9—Eight men are missing in a fire which destroyed one and possibly two vessels in a mysterious accident and fire on Lake Pontchartrain, off Little Point, La, about noon to-day. The vessels were the str Meriwether, used in transporting automobiles between New Orleans and Lake Charles, and the launch Ramsey. The Ramsey was towing the Meriwether, which caught fire in an unknown manner and sank. Aaron Cox, owner of the vessel, and two sailors escaped. Two other members of the crew are missing. What happened to the Ramsey could not be learned. She carried a crew of six men. PORTLAND, July 7—Str Transportation while being shifted Wednesday night at her berth went aground; she was soon floated and proceeded 800 str Baltimore. YARMOUTH, July 9—Schr Edith Rose of Gloucester is ashore at Don Portage; a tug has been sent to her assistance.


