to protect existing social legislation; to seek an interclass understanding and to make possible the fulfilling of the reparations obligations to the furthest possible degree through large participation of capital.

The industrial party at their meeting next week can concede such generalities without difficulty. When THE NEW YORK HERALD correspondent called the attention of Socialist leaders to a clause relating to class harmony, they replied that they are as yet not qualified to take over the machinery of production, and added: "It is better to assure the gains we have made than to provoke a new conflict which we are unable to win."

The Goerlitz decision postpones the fusion of the two Socialist parties which already are collaborating in many places. The only active opposition to a compromise, however, comes from the radical workers who are practically leaderless. This opposition is finding the only real sympathy from Communists.

A broader significance of the Goerlitz decision is that the taxation conflict which is now dominating German politics will be less likely to become purely a class war.
